- 6 WHEREAS, the Honorable Stephen J. Kirchmayr of Jackson,
- 7 Mississippi, Counsel and Court Administrator for the Mississippi
- 8 Supreme Court and the state court system, passed away on Tuesday,
- 9 October 4, 2005, at his home; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Kirchmayr, an attorney, worked in public service
- 11 for 28 years in the office of the State Attorney General, at the
- 12 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and at
- 13 the Mississippi Supreme Court. He served under four state
- 14 attorneys general and five chief justices of the Mississippi
- 15 Supreme Court; and
- 16 WHEREAS, for the past 12 years, Mr. Kirchmayr served as
- 17 Counsel and Court Administrator to the Mississippi Supreme Court.
- 18 He oversaw financial operations, personnel, planning and all other
- 19 non-judicial functions of the Mississippi Supreme Court and Court
- 20 of Appeals; and
- 21 WHEREAS, as Supreme Court Administrator, he oversaw
- 22 implementation of a new court system for the state after the
- 23 Legislature created the 10-member Court of Appeals in 1994. He
- 24 oversaw technological improvements for the Supreme Court, Court of
- 25 Appeals and the state trial courts. He supervised programs which
- 26 made the decisions, docket and oral arguments of the Supreme Court
- 27 and Court of Appeals available to the public via the Internet. He
- 28 oversaw resource improvements for trial courts; and
