## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 2008: State agency budgets; authorize flexibility in transfers and expenditures due to Hurricane Katrina emergency.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- SECTION 1. Section 27-104-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 27-104-17. (1) An allotment period shall be one-half (1/2)
- 13 of twelve (12) months, and expenditure one-half (1/2) of the
- 14 appropriated amount, unless otherwise specified in the
- 15 appropriation bill or justified by the agency to the Department of
- 16 Finance and Administration, and the first allotment period shall
- 17 commence on July 1. Estimates shall be filed with the Department
- 18 of Finance and Administration not later than the first day of the
- 19 month preceding the beginning period.
- 20 Provided further, that the Department of Finance and
- 21 Administration may, in its discretion, restrict an agency to
- 22 monthly allotment period when it becomes evident that an agency's
- 23 rate of expenditure to date indicates this restriction will be
- 24 necessary to prevent depletion of its appropriation prior to the
- 25 close of the fiscal year or when the condition of the State
- 26 General Fund requires monthly monitoring and control of the rate
- 27 of General Fund expenditures.
- 28 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3), and
- 29 unless otherwise specified in the agency appropriation bill, in
- 30 the event any emergency or unforeseen circumstances shall arise,

the agency head may authorize increases in major objects of 31 32 expenditure within each specific budget within each appropriation bill in total amounts not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the 33 34 appropriated amount of each object, provided that other major objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar 35 36 amount. No transfers shall be authorized which increase or decrease the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and 37 38 Fringe Benefits," or which increase the major object of 39 expenditure "Capital Outlay - Equipment." The agency head shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative 40 41 Budget Office, the Department of Finance and Administration, and the State Auditor, on or before the fifteenth of the month prior 42 to the effective date of the transfer. The transfer shall be 43 44 effective the first working day of the month following timely 45 submissions required herein. In cases of extreme hardship, certified in writing by the agency head and submitted with timely 46 submissions required herein, the Executive Director of the 47 48 Department of Finance and Administration, in his discretion, may authorize an earlier effective date for the transfer. 49 50 (3) From and after passage and until June 30, 2006, due to 51 the unforeseen financial circumstances caused by Hurricane 52 Katrina, the agency heads of the following state agencies, with 53 the approval of the Department of Finance and Administration, may 54 authorize increases in major objects of expenditure within each 55 specific budget within each appropriation bill, provided that 56 other major objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar amount: State Contractors Board, State 57 Veterans' Affairs Board, State Board of Engineers and Land 58 Surveyors, State Board of Animal Health, State Pharmacy Board, 59 60 Mississippi Nursing Board, Port of Gulfport, Mississippi

Department, Mississippi Department of Mental Health, Mississippi

Department of Employment Security, Mississippi Insurance

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Department of Finance and Administration, Mississippi Department 64 of Human Services, Mississippi Emergency Management Authority (MEMA), Mississippi Department of Health, Mississippi Department 65 66 of Marine Resources, Mississippi Gaming Commission, State Tax Commission, Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services, 67 Mississippi Gulf Coast Coliseum, Secretary of State, Mississippi 68 Department of Archives and History, Mississippi Department of 69 Transportation, and the Office of State Aid Road Construction of 70 the Mississippi Department of Transportation. The agency head 71 shall submit written justification for the transfer(s) to the 72 73 Department of Finance and Administration, the Legislative Budget Office and the State Auditor on or before the fifteenth of the 74 75 month prior to the effective date of the transfer. The transfer 76 shall be effective the first working day of the month following timely submissions and approval required herein. In cases of 77 78 extreme hardship, certified in writing by the agency head and timely submitted as required herein, the Executive Director of the 79 80 Department of Finance and Administration, in his discretion, may 81 authorize an earlier effective date for the transfer. SECTION 2. Section 27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 82 amended as follows: 83 84 27-104-21. (1) All general and special fund agencies shall, upon making application for federal funds, forward a summary of 85 86 such applications to the Legislative Budget Office. 87 Legislative Budget Office shall have an opportunity to review such 88 applications and make its comments thereon to the Executive Director of the Department of Finance and Administration and the 89 state agency making application. Unless otherwise specified in 90 91 the appropriation bill, the Executive Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall have the authority to approve 92 93 escalations in a budget using one hundred percent (100%) federal 94 money.

97	(2) The Executive Director of the Department of Finance and
98	Administration shall have the authority to approve escalations of
99	funds and employee positions in the following budgets using one
100	hundred percent (100%) federal or other special source funds

113	employee positions funded one hundred percent (100%) by or from
114	federal funds may be authorized by the Executive Director of the
115	Department of Finance and Administration subject to the rules and
116	regulations of the State Personnel Board. No federal or other
117	special source funds may be expended for programs or activities
118	other than those which have been authorized by act of the
119	Legislature or which are encompassed by a state agency's program
120	structure as provided by law, provided, however, that any
121	expenditures related to a Hurricane Katrina relief program shall
122	be specifically authorized. The Executive Director of the

151 deposited directly into the Statewide Cost Allocation Fund, which

152 is hereby established within the State Treasury. An agency's

153 failure to timely apply for such reimbursement shall be condition

154 sufficient to authorize the Department of Finance and

155 Administration to transfer an amount equal to not less than fifty

156 percent (50%) nor more than one hundred percent (100%) of the

157 total amount designated to such agency in the applicable fixed

158 cost agreement of the state central service cost allocation plan.

159	These funds shall be transferred from any available funds within
160	such agency into the Statewide Cost Allocation Fund upon execution
161	of a requisition for issuance of warrant by the Executive Director
162	of the Department of Finance and Administration. Any funds on
163	hand in said Statewide Cost Allocation Fund at the end of the
164	fiscal year shall lapse into the State General Fund.
165	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
166	and after its passage.

## Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-104-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL TRANSFERS BETWEEN MAJOR BUDGET CATEGORIES BY CERTAIN STATE AGENCIES DUE TO FINANCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES CAUSED BY HURRICANE KATRINA; TO AMEND SECTION 27-104-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ESCALATE AND EXPEND CERTAIN FEDERAL OR SPECIAL SOURCE FUNDS DUE TO FINANCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES CAUSED BY HURRICANE KATRINA; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
