## HOUSE BILL NO. 321

1 2 3 4 5 6	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-151-85, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS TO REIMBURSE TEMPORARY OR SUBSTITUTE SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS FOR THE COSTS REQUIRED FOR A COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE AND TO AUTHORIZE THE SPECIAL STATE SCHOOLS ADMINISTERED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO REIMBURSE SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS FOR SUCH COST; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. Section 37-151-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9	amended as follows:
10	37-151-85. (1) The amount to be allotted by the State Board
11	of Education for transportation shall be determined as follows:
12	The State Department of Education shall calculate the cost of
13	transportation in school districts by ascertaining the average
14	cost per pupil in average daily attendance of transported pupils
15	in school districts classified in different density groups as
16	determined by the State Department of Education. Based on these
17	calculations, the State Department of Education shall develop a
18	scale for determining the allowable cost per pupil in different
19	density groups, which scale shall provide greatest allowance per
20	pupil transported in school districts with lowest densities and
21	smallest allowance per pupil in school districts with highest
22	densities. The total allowance in the adequate education program
23	for transported children for any school district for the current
24	year shall be the average daily attendance of the transported
25	children for the nine (9) months of the prior year, multiplied by
26	the allowance per transported pupil as provided herein. However,
27	the State Department of Education is hereby authorized and
28	empowered to make proper adjustments in allotments, under rules
29	and regulations of the State Board of Education, in cases where

- 97 (6) The State Board of Education, acting through the
- 98 Department of Education, may compensate school bus drivers, to
- 99 include temporary or substitute bus drivers, who are providing
- 100 driving services to the various state operated schools, such as
- 101 the Mississippi School for the Deaf, the Mississippi School for
- 102 the Blind, the Mississippi School of the Arts, the Mississippi
- 103 School for Math and Science and any other similar state operated
- 104 schools, for actual expenses incurred when acquiring an initial
- 105 commercial license or any renewal of a commercial license in order
- 106 to drive a school bus, to include the expense, not to exceed One
- 107 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), of acquiring an initial medical exam or
- 108 any renewal of a medical exam in order to qualify for a commercial
- 109 driver's license.
