## HOUSE BILL NO. 333

1 2 3	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-35-18, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE AGE FOR EXEMPTION FROM REAL ESTATE BROKER CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. Section 73-35-18, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6	amended as follows:
7	73-35-18. (1) Each individual applicant for renewal of a
8	license issued by the Mississippi Real Estate Commission shall, on
9	or before the expiration date of his license, or at a time
10	directed by the commission, submit proof of completion of not less
11	than sixteen (16) clock hours of approved course work to the
12	commission, in addition to any other requirements for renewal.
13	The sixteen (16) clock hours' course work requirement shall apply
14	to each two-year license renewal, and hours in excess thereof
15	shall not be cumulated or credited for the purposes of subsequent
16	license renewals except as provided in this subsection (1). The
17	commission shall develop standards for approval of courses and
18	shall require certification of such course work of the applicant.
19	The commission may determine any required subject matter within
20	the mandated sixteen (16) hours; provided that the required
21	subjects shall not exceed eight (8) hours of the total sixteen
22	(16) hours. Approved continuing education hours earned in the
23	final three (3) months of a licensee's renewal period, if in
24	excess of the required minimum sixteen (16) hours, may be carried
25	over and credited to the next renewal period. However, no more
26	than six (6) hours may be carried over in this manner. Any member
27	of the Mississippi Legislature who has a real estate license shall

28 be credited with eight (8) hours of credit for the attendance of

29 each year of a legislative session. No person may receive

30 continuing education credit for prelicense education courses

31 taken, except as follows: a licensee whose license is on inactive

32 status and whose continuing education credits are at least thirty

33 (30) hours in arrears may, at the discretion of the commission,

34 receive continuing education credit for retaking prelicense

35 coursework, provided the entire prelicense course is retaken.

36 (2) This section shall apply to renewals of licenses which

expire on and after July 1, 1994; however, an applicant for first

38 renewal who has been licensed for not more than one (1) year shall

not be required to comply with this section for the first renewal

40 of the applicant's license. The provisions of this section shall

41 not apply to persons who have held a broker's or salesperson's

42 license in this state for at least twenty-five (25) years and who

43 are older than sixty-five (65) years of age. Inactive licensees

44 are not required to meet the real estate continuing education

45 requirements specified in this section; however, such inactive

46 licensees, before activating their license to active status, must

cumulatively meet requirements missed during the period their

48 license was inactive.

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- 49 (3) The commission shall promulgate rules and regulations as
- 50 necessary to accomplish the purposes of this section in accordance
- 51 with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law.
- 52 (4) Any person who has been licensed as a real estate broker
- 53 and allowed his license to expire for a period of less than five
- 54 (5) years shall be eligible for reinstatement upon completion of
- 55 the education requirements and payment of all penalties and
- 56 reinstatement fees as prescribed by the commission. This
- 57 subsection (4) of this section shall stand repealed from and after
- 58 December 31, 1994.
- 59 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- and after July 1, 2006.
