HOUSE BILL NO. 379

1 AN ACT TO CODIFY NEW SECTION 37-143-10, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 2 1972, TO PROVIDE FOR A "MISSISSIPPI CRITICAL NEEDS NURSING FACULTY 3 INCENTIVE PROGRAM"; TO AUTHORIZE SALARY SUPPLEMENTS FOR NURSING 4 FACULTY; TO ESTABLISH AN EMPLOYER-ASSISTED HOUSING PROGRAM FOR 5 NURSING FACULTY; TO PROVIDE HOME LOANS TO NURSING EDUCATORS; TO 6 PROVIDE RELOCATION EXPENSES TO NURSES WHO AGREE TO BECOME NURSING 7 FACULTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
9 SECTION 1. The following provision shall be codified as
10 Section 37-143-10, Mississippi Code of 1972:

11 <u>37-143-10.</u> (1) There is established a "Mississippi Critical 12 Needs Nursing Faculty Incentive Program." This program shall be 13 implemented by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 14 Higher Learning and the State Board for Community and Junior 15 Colleges to produce more nursing faculty at the schools of nursing 16 in Mississippi in order to fill the health care needs of this 17 state.

(2) Using funds specifically appropriated for that purpose 18 by the Legislature, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 19 20 Higher Learning shall implement a three-year across-the-board 21 salary increase of not less than Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) 22 nor more than Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) in fiscal year 23 2007, fiscal year 2008 and fiscal year 2009 for all registered 24 nurses who are faculty in approved undergraduate and graduate 25 nursing programs in the state. Using funds specifically 26 appropriated for that purpose by the Legislature, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall implement a three-year 27 28 across-the-board salary increase of not less than Six Thousand 29 Dollars (\$6,000.00) nor more than Eight Thousand Dollars

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(\$8,000.00) in fiscal year 2007, fiscal year 2008 and fiscal year 30 31 2009 for all registered nurses who are faculty in approved 32 associate degree nursing programs in the state. This incentive is intended to bring salaries for nursing faculty within the average 33 34 for the geographic area in which the State of Mississippi competes 35 for nursing faculty. Salary supplements under this subsection 36 shall be allocated to nursing faculty who enter into contract with the appropriate school of nursing obligating themselves to spend a 37 period of time of not less than three (3) years in teaching 38 nursing at any accredited school of nursing in Mississippi. 39 Any 40 person who does not render three (3) years' service as a nursing faculty in an approved school of nursing in Mississippi under this 41 program shall be liable to the appropriate board for one-third 42 (1/3) of the total amount of the salary supplement granted under 43 the program for each year that the person does not render that 44 service, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate 45 46 at the time the person discontinues his service. If a claim for 47 repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an 48 49 additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the State 50 51 Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall jointly establish such rules and regulations as deemed necessary and proper to carry 52 out the purposes and intent of this subsection. 53

54 (3) There is established the Mississippi Employer-Assisted Housing Program for nursing faculty, which shall be a special home 55 56 loan program for any eligible registered nurse who renders service 57 on the faculty in an approved undergraduate and graduate nursing 58 program or associate degree nursing program in Mississippi. The home loan program shall be administered by the Board of Trustees 59 60 of State Institutions of Higher Learning jointly with the State 61 Board for Community and Junior Colleges in conjunction with the 62 Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae). 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Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the State 63 64 Board for Community and Junior Colleges may contract with one or 65 more public or private entities to provide assistance in 66 implementing and administering the program, and shall adopt rules 67 and regulations regarding the implementation and administration of 68 the program. Participation in the loan program shall be available to any registered nurse who renders service as faculty in an 69 70 approved school of nursing in the State of Mississippi. Any person who receives a loan under this program shall be required to 71 72 purchase a house located in the State of Mississippi and reside in 73 that house. The maximum amount of a loan that may be made under 74 this program to any person shall be Thirty Thousand Dollars 75 (\$30,000.00). Any loan made under this program to a person who 76 actually renders service as nursing faculty in an approved school 77 of nursing in Mississippi shall be converted to an interest-free grant on the basis of one (1) year's service for one-third (1/3)78 79 of the amount of the loan. Any person who does not render three 80 (3) years' service as nursing faculty in Mississippi shall be liable to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 81 82 Learning and/or the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for one-third (1/3) of the amount of the loan for each year the 83 84 person does not render that service, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person discontinues his 85 86 or her service. If a claim for repayment under this subsection is 87 placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable 88 89 attorney's fee. All funds received by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning or the State Board for 90 Community and Junior Colleges as repayment of loans by program 91 participants shall be deposited in the Mississippi Critical Needs 92 93 Nursing Faculty Incentive Fund, which is created in the State 94 Treasury.

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Subject to the availability of funds specifically 95 (4) 96 appropriated for that purpose by the Legislature, any registered 97 nurse relocating to any geographical area of the State of 98 Mississippi in order to render service as nursing faculty at an 99 approved undergraduate and graduate or associate degree nursing 100 program located within the state shall be eligible for 101 reimbursement for their moving expenses by the Board of Trustees 102 of State Institutions of Higher Learning or the State Board for 103 Community and Junior Colleges, as the case may be. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning jointly with the 104 105 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the administration of the 106 107 relocation expense reimbursement component of the Mississippi 108 Critical Needs Nursing Faculty Incentive Program. As a condition for participation in this component of the program, nursing 109 faculty shall agree to employment at the school of nursing for a 110 111 period of not less than three (3) years. Any person failing to 112 comply with this employment commitment shall immediately be in breach of contract and become liable immediately to the Board of 113 114 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning or the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, as the case may be, for 115 116 the sum of the relocation expenses granted to that person, less one-third (1/3) of the amount of that sum for each year that 117 service was rendered, plus interest accruing at the current 118 119 Stafford Loan rate at the time the breach occurs. If a claim for repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands of an 120 121 attorney for collection after default, then the obligor shall be 122 liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee. All funds received from the repayment of relocation expenses 123 by program participants shall be deposited in the Mississippi 124 125 Critical Needs Nursing Faculty Incentive Fund.

126 (5) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 127 Learning or the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges may H. B. No. 379 *HR07/R777* 06/HR07/R777 PAGE 4 (RF\HS) grant a deferral for cause when there is no employment position immediately available for a program participant. After any such period of deferral, the nursing faculty shall begin or resume the required teaching duties or shall become liable to the appropriate board for salary supplement, housing loan or relocation expense repayment.

134 The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher (6) Learning and the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges 135 136 shall jointly prepare an annual report for the Legislature, to be submitted by December 1 of each year beginning in 2006, which 137 138 shall assess the impact of the Mississippi Critical Needs Nursing Faculty Incentive Program on the employment of registered nurses 139 140 as faculty in approved schools of nursing. The report shall 141 include, at a minimum, the number of persons who have participated in each component of the program each year and the number of 142 143 persons who have actually rendered service as faculty in Mississippi schools of nursing under the program. 144 145 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

146 and after July 1, 2006.
