HOUSE BILL NO. 388

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2	AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO ENTER
3	INTO A MUTUAL AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF ALABAMA ESTABLISHING
4	RECIPROCITY AS TO THE USE OF RESIDENT FISHING LICENSES BY CITIZENS
5	OF EACH STATE SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER; AND FOR RELATED
6	PURPOSES.

- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 49-4-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 49-4-4. (1) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, to be composed of 11
- five (5) persons appointed by the Governor, with the advice and 12
- consent of the Senate, for a term of five (5) years. One (1) 13
- person shall be appointed from each congressional district. The 14
- initial terms of the members shall be one (1), two (2), three (3), 15
- four (4) and five (5) years, respectively. Thereafter, all terms 16
- 17 shall be for five (5) years. An appointment to fill a vacancy
- which arises for reasons other than by expiration of a term of 18
- office shall be made from the respective congressional district 19
- 20 for the unexpired term only.
- (2) The commission shall elect from its membership a 21
- 22 chairman who shall preside over meetings and a vice chairman who
- shall preside in the absence of the chairman or when the chairman 23
- 24 shall be excused.

- 25 The commission shall adopt rules and regulations
- governing times and places for meetings and governing the manner 26
- 27 of conducting its business. Each member of the commission shall
- take the oath prescribed by Section 268 of the Mississippi 28
- Constitution, and shall enter into bond in the amount of Thirty 29 *HR40/R786* 388 H. B. No. G1/206/HR40/R786

- 30 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to be approved by the Secretary of
- 31 State, conditioned according to law, and payable to the State of
- 32 Mississippi before assuming the duties of office. Any member who
- 33 shall not attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the
- 34 commission shall be subject to removal by a majority vote of the
- 35 commission members.
- 36 (4) The members of the commission shall receive no annual
- 37 salary but shall receive per diem compensation as authorized by
- 38 law for each day devoted to the discharge of official duties and
- 39 shall be entitled to reimbursement for all actual and necessary
- 40 expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, including
- 41 mileage as authorized by law.
- 42 The commission shall be composed of persons with a
- 43 demonstrated history of involvement in at least one (1) of the
- 44 matters of jurisdiction of the commission and whose employment and
- 45 activities are not in conflict. All of the commissioners shall be
- 46 an active outdoorsman holding a resident hunting or fishing
- 47 license in at least five (5) of the ten (10) years preceding
- 48 appointment. A member shall not have a record of conviction of
- 49 violation of fish or game laws and regulations within five (5)
- 50 years preceding appointment or a record of any felony conviction.
- 51 (5) The commission shall have the power to adopt, amend and
- 52 repeal such regulations and rules as may be necessary for the
- 53 operation of the department.
- 54 (6) The commission shall have the power and authority to
- 55 issue all licenses and permits under the jurisdiction of the
- 56 department.
- 57 (7) In the furtherance of its duties and responsibilities,
- 58 the commission may conduct hearings, gather testimony and perform
- 59 other functions required to carry out its powers and duties as
- 60 prescribed by statute.
- 61 (8) The commission shall have all power for conserving,
- 62 managing and developing wildlife and fishery resources except for

- 63 saltwater aquatic life and marine resources under the jurisdiction
- of the Mississippi Commission on Marine Resources.
- 65 (9) The commission may enter into a reciprocal agreement
- 66 with the State of Alabama exempting persons sixty-five (65) years
- of age or older from state fishing license requirements. The
- 68 agreement shall provide that a citizen of either Alabama or
- 69 Mississippi who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older and who
- 70 is authorized to fish in either Alabama or Mississippi under each
- 71 state's respective statutes or regulations shall be entitled to
- 72 fish in both states.
- 73 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 74 and after July 1, 2006.
