- 13 under sixteen (16) years of age must have a certificate of
- 14 satisfactory completion of a hunter education course approved by
- 15 the department before hunting in this state.

- 17 presence and under the direct supervision of a licensed or exempt
- 18 hunter at least twenty-one (21) years of age when the child is
