HOUSE BILL NO. 608

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH A 1 2 TRIMESTER SCHOOL YEAR PILOT PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD TO SELECT UP TO TWELVE SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE 3 PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD TO REPORT TO THE CHAIRMEN OF THE 4 EDUCATION COMMITTEES BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2008, ON THE RESULTS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM AND THE DESIRABILITY OF IMPLEMENTING A TRIMESTER 5 б 7 CALENDAR IN ALL MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL DISTRICTS; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD 8 TO ESTABLISH THE ANNUAL SCHOOL CALENDAR, WHICH MUST BE NO LESS 9 THAN 225 DAYS, FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; TO PRESCRIBE THE CORE CURRICULUM FOR STUDENTS IN SCHOOL 10 11 DISTRICTS PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD TO INCREASE THE ADEQUATE EDUCATION PROGRAM ALLOTMENT TO SCHOOL 12 DISTRICTS PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; TO AMEND SECTION 13 37-13-67, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY TO THE 14 15 PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** (1) The State Board of Education shall establish a Trimester School Year Pilot Program to determine the feasibility and desirability of implementing a trimester school year in all public school districts in the state.

21 (2) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and regulations for the implementation of the pilot program during the 22 2005-2006 school year and for an application process for 23 24 interested school districts to apply for participation in the 25 pilot program. The board may select up to twelve (12) eligible school districts in which the trimester school year calendar will 26 27 be implemented. In selecting participants for the program, the board shall endeavor to include school districts representative of 28 all Mississippi school districts, with consideration given to 29 factors including, but not necessarily limited to, each applying 30 school district's size; accreditation level; urban or rural 31 32 nature; demographic profile; and geographical location. At least 33 one (1) school district in each congressional district, as those

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34 districts exist on July 1, 2006 must be selected for participation 35 in the pilot program unless no application is received by the 36 board from an eligible school district within a particular 37 congressional district.

38 (3) School districts participating in the Trimester School
39 Year Pilot Program must agree to adhere to the trimester school
40 year calendar adopted by the State Board of Education for the
41 2007-2008 and 2006-2009 school years.

(4) Before January 1, 2008, the State Board of Education shall submit a report to the Chairmen of the Education Committees of the House of Representatives and Senate on the results of the Trimester School Year Pilot Program. The report must include recommendations on whether or not the trimester calendar should be implemented on a permanent basis in all or certain public school districts of the state.

SECTION 2. The State Board of Education shall establish a 49 50 school year calendar to be observed by those school districts participating in the Trimester School Year Pilot Program. 51 The opening day of the school term must be the Tuesday immediately 52 53 succeeding the first Monday of September (National Memorial Day). Each trimester must consist of no less than seventy-five (75) days 54 55 in which students and teachers are in regular attendance for scheduled school work. Upon the conclusion of each trimester, 56 there must be a break of no less than fifteen (15) calendar days; 57 58 however, the State Board of Education may designate a total of fourteen (14) days during the breaks as teacher work days or 59 60 in-service training days. The complete scholastic year for school districts participating in the pilot program must be no less than 61 two hundred twenty-five (225) days. The State Board of Education 62 shall designate the legal holidays that may be observed in school 63 64 districts participating in the pilot program.

65 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The core curriculum for students in the 66 fourth through twelfth grades in the school districts

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participating in the Trimester School Year Pilot Program shall 67 68 consist of the following five (5) core courses, each consisting of 69 a minimum of eighteen (18) trimester units of developmental, 70 content-mastery instruction: Language Arts -- Reading Recognition, Reading 71 (a) 72 Comprehension, Spelling, Grammar, Written Expression and 73 Literature; 74 (b) Math -- Math Calculations, Math Reasoning, Business Math, Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, Trigonometry and Calculus; 75 76 (C) Foreign Language -- Written Expression, Verbal 77 Expression and Literature; 78 (d) Social Studies: 79 (i) Eighth and ninth grades -- World History, consisting of four (4) trimesters with each course following an 80 established timeline and incorporating major social, political and 81 economic issues for South and Central America, North America, the 82 Far East, the Middle East, Africa, Australia and Europe, with all 83 84 courses to include related geography segments; (ii) Tenth and eleventh grades -- American 85 86 History, consisting of two (2) trimesters from the Indigenous 87 People through the Civil War and two (2) trimesters from the Civil 88 War to the present; and (iii) Twelfth grade -- United States Government 89 90 and two (2) trimesters of Current Political and Social Issues; and 91 (e) Science -- Earth Science, Biology, Zoology, Chemistry and Physics. 92 93 (2)In each school in those school districts participating in the Trimester School Year Pilot Program, the content area 94 teachers shall develop skill progression-based course outlines 95 identifying the primary and secondary data to be mastered. 96 The principal of the school shall collate and assimilate the 97 98 information into one (1) outline, which shall be forwarded to the 99 school district's central office. 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100 shall collate and assimilate the data gathered from the various 101 schools in that school district into one (1) outline to be 102 submitted to the State Department of Education. The State 103 Department of Education shall collate and assimilate the data 104 gathered from the various school districts participating in the 105 pilot program into one (1) outline. The department shall submit 106 the final outline to a panel of university and college educators for revision. 107

The State Department of Education shall provide 108 (3) 109 standardized tests for the core curriculum defined in this 110 Local school districts shall administer the standardized section. tests in particular subject areas to all students in the public 111 112 schools on the same day, as designated by the State Department of 113 Education. In administering the tests, a classroom teacher may not be permitted to monitor the testing of that teacher's 114 students. All tests must be scored by machine, and the test 115 116 results may be posted only in a pass or fail format.

(4) The State Board of Education shall establish the number of hours of actual teaching which constitutes a school day in those school districts participating in the Trimester School Year Pilot Program. The number of hours of each school day must be sufficient to satisfy the core curriculum requirements established in this section.

In order to sufficiently fund school districts 123 SECTION 4. 124 participating in the Trimester School Year Pilot Program, the State Board of Education shall increase the annual funding for the 125 126 participating school districts under the Mississippi Adequate 127 Education Program by an amount determined by the following The annual allocation to the particular school district 128 formula: under the Mississippi Adequate Education Program will be divided 129 130 by the average number of days that teachers and students are in 131 actual attendance in all Mississippi school districts that are not 132 participating in the pilot program. 133 the Mississippi Adequate Education Program daily allotment, will 134 be multiplied by the difference between two hundred twenty-five (225) and the average number of days that teachers and students 135 136 are in actual attendance in all Mississippi school districts that 137 are not participating in the pilot program. The result of the 138 last calculation will be added to the annual allocation to the particular school district under the Mississippi Adequate 139 140 Education Program.

141 SECTION 5. Section 37-13-67, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 142 amended as follows:

143 37-13-67. Except as otherwise provided under Section 3 of this act for school districts participating in the Trimester 144 145 School Year Pilot Program, twenty (20) days of actual teaching in 146 which both teachers and pupils are in regular attendance for 147 scheduled school work shall constitute a scholastic month. The 148 number of hours of actual teaching which shall constitute a school day in any school district not participating in that pilot program 149 150 shall be determined and fixed by the board of trustees of the school district at not less than five (5) hours nor more than 151 152 eight (8) hours.

153 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 154 and after July 1, 2006.

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
