HOUSE BILL NO. 662

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT A CHILD WILL BE EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENT FOR 1 2 3 HAVING ANY SPECIFIC VACCINATION IN ORDER TO ATTEND A SCHOOL, IF THE CHILD OR THE CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN SUBMITS A CERTIFICATE 4 FROM A PHYSICIAN STATING THAT THE REQUIRED VACCINATION WOULD BE 5 б INJURIOUS TO THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF THE CHILD; TO AUTHORIZE 7 SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, IF THERE IS AN OUTBREAK OF A 8 VACCINE-PREVENTABLE DISEASE AT A SCHOOL, TO EXCLUDE FROM 9 ATTENDANCE ANY CHILD WHO IS NOT VACCINATED AGAINST THAT DISEASE 10 UNTIL THE DISEASE INCUBATION PERIOD HAS EXPIRED OR THE 11 UNVACCINATED CHILD PRESENTS EVIDENCE OF VACCINATION; AND FOR 12 RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

16 41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer 17 shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered 18 best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 19 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary.

20 (2) Except as provided hereinafter, it shall be unlawful for 21 any child to attend any school, kindergarten or similar type facility intended for the instruction of children (hereinafter 22 called "schools"), either public or private, with the exception of 23 any legitimate home instruction program, as defined in Section 24 25 37-13-91, for ten (10) or fewer children who are related within the third degree computed according to the civil law to the 26 operator, unless they * * * first have been vaccinated against 27 those diseases specified by the State Health Officer. 28 29 (3) (a) No child seeking to attend any school shall be required to comply with the requirements of subsection (2) of this 30 section for any specific vaccination in order to attend the 31 school, if the child or the child's parent or guardian submits to 32

the school an affidavit or a certificate signed by a physician who is duly licensed to practice medicine in the United States, in which it is stated that, in the physician's medical judgment and opinion, the required vaccination would be injurious to the health and well-being of the child, whether the injury would be chronic or acute.

39 (b) If there is an outbreak of a vaccine-preventable
40 disease at a school, the administrators of the school, upon the
41 recommendation of the State Health Officer or the local health
42 officer, may exclude from attendance any child who is not
43 vaccinated against that disease until the disease incubation
44 period has expired or the unvaccinated child presents evidence of
45 vaccination.

46 (4) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local 47 health officers or physicians on forms specified by the 48 Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only 49 acceptable means for showing compliance with these immunization 50 requirements, and the responsible school officials shall file the 51 form with the child's record.

52 (5) If a child * * * offers to enroll at a school without 53 having completed the required vaccinations, the local health 54 officer may grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days for 55 <u>that</u> completion when, in the opinion of the health officer, <u>the</u> 56 delay will not cause undue risk to the child, the school or the 57 community. No child shall be enrolled without having had at least 58 one (1) dose of each specified vaccine.

59 <u>(6)</u> Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall 60 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in 61 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health 62 officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of 63 Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both, 64 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing

67 (7) Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening 68 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge 69 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer 70 that all children enrolled are in compliance with immunization 71 requirements.

72 (8) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the 73 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or 74 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished 75 certificates of immunization compliance by the school.

76 (9) It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge 77 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization. Any 78 child not in compliance at the end of ninety (90) days from the 79 opening of the fall term must be suspended until in compliance, 80 unless the health officer * * * attributes the delay to lack of 81 supply of vaccine or some other such factor clearly making 82 compliance impossible.

83 <u>(10)</u> Failure to enforce provisions of this section shall 84 constitute a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, be punishable by 85 fine or imprisonment or both.

86 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 87 and after July 1, 2006.
