HOUSE BILL NO. 849 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 75-24-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO PROVIDE THAT THE PRICE RESTRICTION FOR GOODS AND SERVICES

DURING EMERGENCIES SHALL APPLY STATEWIDE; TO AUTHORIZE THE OFFICE
OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO MONITOR PETROLEUM-BASED FUEL PRICES
THROUGHOUT THE STATE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 75-24-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 75-24-25. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
- 10 following terms shall have the meanings herein ascribed:
- 11 (a) "Person" means a natural person, corporation,
- 12 trust, partnership, incorporated or unincorporated association, or
- 13 any other legal entity.
- 14 (b) "State of emergency" means the duly proclaimed
- 15 existence of conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety
- 16 of persons or property within the state caused by air or water
- 17 pollution, fire, flood, storm, epidemic, earthquake, hurricane,
- 18 resource shortages or other natural or man-made conditions other
- 19 than conditions causing a "state of war emergency," which
- 20 conditions by reasons of their magnitude are or are likely to be
- 21 beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and
- 22 facilities of any single county and/or municipality and require
- 23 combined forces of the state to combat.
- 24 (c) "Local emergency" means the duly proclaimed
- 25 existence of conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety
- 26 of persons and property within the territorial limits of a county
- 27 and/or municipality caused by such conditions as air or water
- 28 pollution, fire, flood, storm, epidemic, earthquake, hurricane,

- 29 resource shortages or other natural or man-made conditions, which
- 30 conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the
- 31 services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the political
- 32 subdivision and require the combined forces of other subdivisions
- 33 or of the state to combat.
- 34 (d) "Value received" means the consideration or payment
- 35 given for the purchase of goods and services.
- 36 (2) Whenever, under the Mississippi Emergency Management
- 37 Law, Sections 33-15-1 through 33-15-49, a state of emergency * * *
- 38 is declared to exist in this state, then the value received for
- 39 all goods and services sold within the state shall not exceed the
- 40 prices ordinarily charged for comparable goods or services in the
- 41 same market area at or immediately before the declaration of a
- 42 state of emergency * * *. However, the value received may
- 43 include: any expenses, the cost of the goods and services which
- 44 are necessarily incurred in procuring such goods and services
- 45 during a state of emergency or local emergency. The prices
- 46 ordinarily charged for comparable goods or services in the same
- 47 market area do not include temporarily discounted goods or
- 48 services. The same market area does not necessarily mean a single
- 49 provider of goods or services. <u>In addition, when a local</u>
- 50 emergency is declared, then the value received for all goods and
- 51 services sold within that city or county shall not exceed the
- 52 prices ordinarily charged for comparable goods in that local
- 53 jurisdiction.
- 54 (3) Any person who knowingly and willfully violates
- 55 subsection (2) of this section, when the total value * * *
- 56 received during a twenty-four-hour period is Fifty Dollars
- 57 (\$50.00) or more, shall be guilty of a upon conviction shall be
- 58 punished by confinement for a term of not less than one (1) year
- 59 nor more than five (5) years or a fine of not more than Five
- 60 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both.

- (4) Any person who knowingly and willfully violates 61 62 subsection (2) of this section, when the total value * * * received during a twenty-four-hour period is less than Fifty 63 64 Dollars (\$50.00), shall be quilty of a misdemeanor and upon 65 conviction shall be fined not more than One Thousand Dollars 66 (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed six (6) months, or both. The circuit court shall have 67 exclusive jurisdiction over violations under this subsection. 68 69 In addition to the criminal penalties prescribed in (5) subsections (3) and (4), any knowing and willful violation of 70 71 subsection (2) of this section shall be considered an unfair or

 procedures and remedies available under the provisions of this
 chapter for enforcement of prohibited acts and practices contained
 therein.
- 5ECTION 2. (1) The Legislature finds and determines that
 the petroleum industry is an essential element of the Mississippi
 economy and is therefore of vital importance to the health and
 welfare of all Mississippians.
- 80 The Legislature further finds and determines that a complete and thorough understanding of the operations of the 81 82 petroleum industry is required by state government at all times to enable it to respond to possible shortages, oversupplies or other 83 84 disruptions and to assess whether all consumers including 85 emergency service agencies, state and local government agencies, and agricultural and business consumers of petroleum products have 86 87 adequate and economic supplies of fuel.
- (2) The Attorney General is authorized to monitor

 petroleum-based fuel prices throughout the state, using the Oil

 Price Information Services (OPIS) or any other service, approved

 by the Attorney General, that monitors petroleum-based fuel prices

 throughout the state. The Attorney General may promulgate such

- 93 rules and regulations necessary to effectuate only his authority
- 94 to monitor petroleum-based fuel prices.
- 95 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 96 and after July 1, 2006.
