## HOUSE BILL NO. 934

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE WAIVER OF TUITION AT THE STATE  
2 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND THE COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR  
3 COLLEGES FOR CERTAIN DISABLED VETERANS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED  
4 FORCES; TO REQUIRE APPLICATIONS FOR A WAIVER TO INCLUDE  
5 DOCUMENTATION CONCERNING AN APPLICANT'S DISABILITY; TO PROVIDE  
6 THAT TUITION MAY BE WAIVED FOR BOTH FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME  
7 STUDENTS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE  
8 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING SHALL BE THE ADMINISTERING AGENCY  
9 OF THE TUITION WAIVER PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

11 **SECTION 1.** (1) Beginning with the 2006-2007 academic year,  
12 any resident of the State of Mississippi who is an honorably  
13 discharged veteran of the United States Armed Forces and who has a  
14 service-connected disability that is permanently and no less than  
15 seventy percent (70%) disabling according to the rules and  
16 regulations of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs  
17 may apply for a waiver of tuition at any state institution of  
18 higher learning or public community or junior college in the  
19 state.

20 (2) A veteran who is qualified for a tuition waiver under  
21 this section who also is enrolled in or accepted for enrollment at  
22 a state institution of higher learning or a public community or  
23 junior college in Mississippi may apply for a waiver of tuition.  
24 An application must be accompanied by proper proof that the  
25 applicant is an honorably discharged veteran of the United States  
26 Armed Forces and that the veteran has a service-connected  
27 disability that is permanently and no less than seventy percent  
28 (70%) disabling according to the rules and regulations of the  
29 United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

30 (3) A waiver of tuition awarded under this section may not  
31 exceed the actual cost of tuition at the institution or college at  
32 which the veteran is enrolled or accepted for enrollment. For  
33 purposes of this section, the term "tuition" means the semester,  
34 trimester or term charges and does not include books, housing,  
35 food, school supplies, materials, dues or fees for  
36 extra-curricular activities. Both full-time and part-time  
37 students may apply for a waiver under this section. Students  
38 enrolling on a full-time basis may receive a maximum of four (4)  
39 annual waivers, and in those instances when a degree program  
40 requires five (5) years for completion, five (5) annual waivers.  
41 The number of waivers which may be made to a student attending  
42 school on a part-time basis may not exceed the length of time  
43 required to complete the associate or baccalaureate degree or  
44 certificate program toward which the student is working. A person  
45 who has a baccalaureate degree is not eligible for a waiver of  
46 tuition under this section, and any person who has an associate  
47 degree may receive waivers only in furtherance of a baccalaureate  
48 degree.

49 (4) As a condition for renewal of a waiver of tuition, a  
50 student must make steady academic progress toward a certificate or  
51 associate or baccalaureate degree, as certified by the  
52 institution's registrar, and must maintain a cumulative grade  
53 point average of at least 2.00 calculated on a 4.00 scale at the  
54 end of each term.

55 (5) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher  
56 Learning and the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges  
57 jointly shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to carry  
58 out the purposes of this section. The Board of Trustees of State  
59 Institutions of Higher Learning is the administering agency of the  
60 tuition waiver program.

61 (6) It is the intent of the Legislature that all veterans  
62 who are eligible for a waiver of tuition under this section be

63 granted a waiver. If funding at a state institution or community  
64 or junior college is insufficient to provide for the tuition being  
65 waived for all eligible applicants at that institution or college,  
66 the board shall grant the tuition waivers to first-time students  
67 on a first-come, first-served basis; however, priority  
68 consideration must be given to persons previously receiving  
69 waivers under this section who are making steady academic progress  
70 toward completion of a certificate program or associate or  
71 baccalaureate degree.

72 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from  
73 and after July 1, 2006.
