HOUSE BILL NO. 947

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 27-15-251 AND 27-17-521, MISSISSIPPI 2 CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE FOR THE REVOCATION OF PRIVILEGE LICENSES 3 UNDER THE STATEWIDE PRIVILEGE TAX LAW AND THE LOCAL PRIVILEGE TAX 4 LAW FOR ANY PERSON CONVICTED OF HIRING PERSONS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR 5 EMPLOYMENT IN THE UNITED STATES UNDER APPLICABLE FEDERAL AND STATE 6 LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 27-15-251, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

10 27-15-251. (1) Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be quilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction 11 thereof shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars 12 (\$500.00), or imprisoned in the county jail not exceeding six (6) 13 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of 14 the court within the limitations aforesaid; and such fine and 15 imprisonment shall be in addition to any other penalty imposed by 16 17 any particular section of this chapter. The courts of the county in which the offender resides, or if a company, in which it 18 carries on business, shall have jurisdiction to enforce this 19 20 subsection. And persons failing to pay the privilege taxes imposed by this chapter, and to obtain a license as hereby 21 required, but pursuing the business for which a privilege tax is 22 imposed without procuring such license, may be proceeded against 23 24 by suit, in addition to being dealt with criminally; and the officer required to collect the tax may seize and sell any 25 property of such person liable for such tax and penalty, in the 26 same manner as he may distrain and sell property of other 27 taxpayers delinquent for the payment of ad valorem taxes due on 28 29 personal property. 34 (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in buying 35 cotton, cotton seed, corn, grain or field seed of any kind, pecans, peanuts, or other nuts between the hours of 6:00 P.M. 36 and 37 7:00 A.M. and any person convicted under this section shall be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or imprisoned in 38 39 the county jail for not less than ninety (90) days or both. 40 SECTION 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction 43 thereof shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars 44 (\$500.00), or imprisoned in the county jail not exceeding six (6) 45 46 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of 47 the court within the limitation aforesaid; and such fine and imprisonment shall be in addition to any other penalty imposed by 48 49 any particular section of this chapter. The courts of the county in which the offender resides, or if a company, in which it 50 51 carries on business, shall have jurisdiction to enforce this Any persons failing to pay the privilege taxes imposed 52 section. 53 by this chapter, and to obtain a license as hereby required, but 54 pursuing the business for which a privilege tax is imposed without procuring such license, may be proceeded against by suit, in 55 56 addition to being dealt with criminally; and the officer required 57 to collect the tax may seize and sell any property of such person liable for such tax and penalty, in the same manner as he may 58 59 distrain and sell property of other taxpayers delinquent for the 60 payment of ad valorem taxes due on personal property. 65 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 66 and after July 1, 2006.
