HOUSE BILL NO. 974

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-1-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REVISE CONSPIRACY AS IT APPLIES TO THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED 2 3 SUBSTANCES LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. Section 97-1-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 97-1-1. If two (2) or more persons conspire either: 8 (a) To commit a crime; or 9 Falsely and maliciously to indict another for a (b) crime, or to procure to be complained of or arrested for a crime; 10 11 or 12 (c) Falsely to institute or maintain an action or suit 13 of any kind; or (d) To cheat and defraud another out of property by any 14 15 means which are in themselves criminal, or which, if executed, would amount to a cheat, or to obtain money or any other property 16 or thing by false pretense; or 17 18 (e) To prevent another from exercising a lawful trade or calling, or doing any other lawful act, by force, threats, 19 20 intimidation, or by interfering or threatening to interfere with 21 tools, implements, or property belonging to or used by another, or with the use or employment thereof; or 22 (f) To commit any act injurious to the public health, 23 to public morals, trade or commerce, or for the perversion or 24 obstruction of justice, or of the due administration of the laws; 25 26 or

To overthrow or violate the laws of this state 27 (g) 28 through force, violence, threats, intimidation, or otherwise; or 29 (h) To accomplish any unlawful purpose, or a lawful 30 purpose by any unlawful means; such persons, and each of them, 31 shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction may be punished by 32 a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or by imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or by both. 33 34 Provided, that where the crime conspired to be committed is capital murder or murder as defined by law or is a violation of 35 Section 41-29-139(a)(1) or Section 41-29-139(c)(1)(D) and (E), 36 37 Section 41-29-139(c)(2)(F) and (G) or Section 41-29-313(1)(a), Mississippi Code of 1972, being provisions of the Uniform 38 39 Controlled Substances Law, the offense shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) 40 or by imprisonment for not more than twenty (20) years, or by 41 both. 42

Provided, that where the crime conspired to be committed is a misdemeanor, then upon conviction said crime shall be punished as a misdemeanor as provided by law.
