HOUSE BILL NO. 1034

AN ACT TO ENACT THE MISSISSIPPI DELTA REGION REVITALIZATION ACT OF 2006; TO MAKE LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS; TO CREATE THE SPECIAL 3 TASK FORCE FOR REVITALIZATION OF THE MISSISSIPPI DELTA REGION; TO 4 PROVIDE FOR THE COMPOSITION OF THE TASK FORCE; TO ESTABLISH WITHIN THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AN 5 6 OFFICE TO SERVE THE TASK FORCE; TO SET FORTH DUTIES AND 7 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE, AND TO REQUIRE THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE STAFF AND OTHER SUPPORT TO THE OFFICE; TO PROVIDE THAT THE TASK FORCE SHALL FUNCTION AS AN 8 9 10 INDEPENDENT RESEARCH AND ANALYTICAL GROUP CHARGED WITH SETTING 11 SHORT-RANGE AND LONG-RANGE GOALS FOR THE REVITALIZATION OF THE MISSISSIPPI DELTA REGION; TO REQUIRE THE HOLDING OF PUBLIC 12 HEARINGS IN THE REGION AND THE PREPARATION OF A LONG-RANGE ACTION 13 PLAN FOR THE REVITALIZATION OF THE REGION AND SPECIFY THE PARTS OF 14 15 THE PLAN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. This act may be cited as the "Mississippi Delta 17 18 Region Revitalization Act of 2006." 19 SECTION 2. (1) For purposes of this act, the Mississippi Delta Region, which may be hereinafter referred to as the region, 20 21 shall be defined as the western section of the State of Mississippi that lies between the Mississippi and Yazoo Rivers, 22 23 encompassing in part or whole the counties of Bolivar, Carroll, 24 Coahoma, Holmes, Humphreys, Issaquena, Leflore, Quitman, Sharkey, Sunflower, Tallahatchie, Tunica, Warren, Washington and Yazoo. 25

(2) The Legislature finds that the prospective well-being of 26 27 the people of the Mississippi Delta Region of the state requires that the economic and other development of the region should be 28 29 strategically, comprehensively and exhaustively planned and that the plan be systematically implemented. The Legislature further 30 finds that the state should foster open communication between 31 32 government and the private sectors of our economy in the Mississippi Delta Region and that the state should provide a 33

- 34 policy, a vision and a framework to encourage an environment
- 35 conducive to the revitalization of our state's Delta region.
- 36 (3) The Legislature hereby declares that the public policy
- 37 of this state requires an overall, comprehensive and coordinated
- 38 plan for maximum and accelerated revitalization of the Mississippi
- 39 Delta Region.
- 40 **SECTION 3.** (1) The Special Task Force for Revitalization of
- 41 the Mississippi Delta Region is hereby created. The task force
- 42 shall be composed of twenty-one (21) members, to be appointed as
- 43 follows:
- 44 (a) Four (4) members of the Mississippi House of
- 45 Representatives who reside in the Mississippi Delta Region,
- 46 appointed by the Speaker of the House.
- 47 (b) Four (4) members of the Mississippi State Senate,
- 48 who reside in the Mississippi Delta Region, appointed by the
- 49 Lieutenant Governor.
- 50 (c) One (1) member from the state's public
- 51 universities, one (1) member from the state's junior colleges and
- 52 one (1) member from the Mississippi Delta Region who is not a
- 53 state legislator, appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 54 Representatives.
- (d) One (1) member from the state's public
- 56 universities, one (1) member from the state's junior colleges and
- 57 one (1) member from the Mississippi Delta Region who is not a
- 58 state legislator, appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.
- (e) One (1) member from the membership or staffs of the
- 60 Mississippi Association of Supervisors and the Mississippi
- 61 Municipal Association. These members will be appointed to the
- 62 task force by the Governor from recommendations made to the board
- 63 by the respective organizations.
- (f) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 65 Development Authority or his designee.

- (g) Four (4) members to be selected by the Governor,
- 67 three (3) of whom shall be representatives of business or
- 68 entrepreneurial enterprises in the Mississippi Delta Region.
- 69 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the task force
- 70 will be organized, selected and constituted in such a way that it
- 71 represents the most talented individuals who could possibly be
- 72 assembled to address the concerns and issues associated with the
- 73 revitalization of the Mississippi Delta Region. Task force
- 74 members shall be appointed by July 15, 2006, and the task force
- 75 shall have its organizational meeting no later than August 1,
- 76 2006. The task force shall elect from among its membership a
- 77 chairman and vice chairman. Terms of service of task force
- 78 members shall coincide with the duration of the task force.
- 79 (3) All persons selected for service on the task force shall
- 80 be creative, knowledgeable and accomplished people with the
- 81 capacity to contribute to the mission of the task force.
- 82 Vacancies on the task force shall be filled in a manner consistent
- 83 with original appointments.
- 84 **SECTION 4.** (1) There is hereby established within the Board
- 85 of Trustees of the State Institutions of Higher Learning an office
- 86 to serve the Special Task Force for Revitalization of the
- 87 Mississippi Delta Region. The office shall:
- 88 (a) Provide staff support, including an employee to
- 89 serve as the task force coordinator, to the task force and shall
- 90 organize and coordinate the work of the task force.
- 91 (b) Make available office space for the task force to
- 92 include conference room facilities.
- 93 (c) Be responsible for preparing and maintaining a
- 94 long-range plan for the revitalization and economic and other
- 95 development of the state's Delta region. The plan shall be
- 96 sufficiently broad in scope so as to address all regional, state,
- 97 national and international economic, demographic, education, work
- 98 force training, community, housing, public health, crime, natural

- 99 resource and infrastructure factors relating to the overall
 100 status, revitalization and development of the Mississippi Delta
 101 Region.
- 102 (d) Work in coordination with the Mississippi 103 Development Authority in all aspects of serving the task force.
- 104 (2) The Mississippi Development Authority shall provide any 105 staff support to the office that it or the task force may request.
- shall be to function as an independent research and analytical
 group charged with setting measurable, achievable and significant
 goals to revitalize the Mississippi Delta Region. The task force
 shall conduct public hearings in the region and make
 recommendations regarding such goals and present findings and
 detailed recommendations which will enable the region to achieve
- the stated goals. Recommendations of the task force shall be specific to the extent that actions needed are explicitly set out
- 115 and supported with in-depth analyses as to the contributions such
- 116 actions would have on the revitalization of the region. All
- 117 recommendations shall be accompanied by specific requests with
- 118 respect to allocation of resources, including any additional
- 119 funding necessary to fund the revitalization activities.
- 120 **SECTION 6.** With research and recommendations prepared by the
- 121 task force, the office shall prepare a long-range action plan for
- 122 the revitalization of the region, which shall consist of five (5)
- 123 parts as provided in this act.
- 124 SECTION 7. Part I of the plan will identify specific,
- 125 quantifiable goals to be accomplished in the next succeeding
- 126 five-, ten- and twenty-year periods. Before proposing the goals
- 127 required for Part I of the plan, at least three (3) public
- 128 hearings shall be held in each of the northern, central and
- 129 southern portions of the region, in order to receive public input
- 130 on the goal setting process and deliberations pertaining to that
- 131 process.

| 132 | The goals proposed by the office shall be reasonable, |
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| 133 | challenging, achievable and shall be expressed in measures of |
| 134 | achievement that would represent comparative and significant |
| 135 | economic progress and revitalization for the region. |
| 136 | SECTION 8. Part II of the economic development plan shall |
| 137 | include: |
| 138 | (a) An inventory and analysis of the region's |
| 139 | competitive advantages and an inventory and analysis of factors |
| 140 | which tend to retard economic and other development in the region; |
| 141 | (b) Identification and analysis of state, national and |
| 142 | international economic trends affecting the region's development; |
| 143 | (c) An analysis and evaluation of the state's taxing |
| 144 | effort as it affects the region's economic development and other |
| 145 | efforts and an analysis of how economic development goals and |
| 146 | objectives in the region relate to projected short- and long-term |
| 147 | state and local revenues dedicated to the region and to the |
| 148 | possible and potential impact on the region's revenue structure; |
| 149 | (d) An identification and analysis of key factors |
| 150 | affecting economic development in the region; |
| 151 | (e) An identification and analysis of factors affecting |
| 152 | industrial location and decisions affecting expansion of existing |
| 153 | business and industry within the region; |
| 154 | (f) An analysis of the region's incentive programs and |
| 155 | economic development strategies and a comparison with other |
| 156 | regions of the state; |
| 157 | (g) An analysis of the region's work force and of the |
| 158 | economic and educational conditions that the work force will face |
| 159 | in future years; |
| 160 | (h) An analysis of and assessment of the minority |
| 161 | business and commercial activity, capability, potential and needs |
| 162 | in the region; |

(i) An analysis of and assessment of income in the

region by various income groups to provide the analytical base for

states and in the federal government which seek to foster, encourage and assist minority involvement in and contributions toward economic development. The programs to be assessed shall include, but not be limited to, set aside procurement programs.

SECTION 9. (1) Part III of the economic development plan shall provide a procedure for monitoring the implementation of efforts proposed by the task force and the plan. In formulating this procedure, the office will survey, identify and analyze every government program and private resource and activity that is available to, that is being applied toward or that contributes to the accomplishment of the goals set in the long-range plan. The resources and programs of local, state and federal government and private business shall be identified and analyzed to determine the specific areas in which they contribute to achievement of the

(2) Each agency and institution of state government involved in economic, demographic, education, work force training, community, housing, public health, crime, natural resources and infrastructure aspects relating to the overall revitalization and development of the Mississippi Delta Region is directed to prepare and submit to the office and the Mississippi Development Authority, work programs covering its activities in the relevant aspects. The office shall specify a uniform format for agencies to follow in preparing their work programs. These work programs shall cover in general the next five (5) years of the plan and, in significant detail, the upcoming fiscal year. Work programs shall be submitted by October 1, 2006, for fiscal year 2007 by those agencies identified as being required to submit work programs.

- 198 phase of the plan shall also make an overall evaluation of the
- 199 relative contributions that the resources and efforts identified
- 200 in Part III are making toward achievement of the overall goals.
- 201 This phase of the plan shall contain specific recommendations for
- 202 inclusion in the region's efforts:
- 203 (a) Specific programs for accelerating the region's
- 204 overall economic development through greater results from the
- 205 state's agricultural resources;
- 206 (b) Specific programs for rural areas of the region and
- 207 those areas and identifiable groups of people with the highest
- 208 unemployment and lowest per capita incomes;
- 209 (c) Specific programs for international trade and the
- 210 attraction of foreign investment through development of
- 211 specialized, university-based or other programs;
- 212 (d) The specific niches that Mississippi has and on
- 213 which it should focus development efforts or those niches the
- 214 region should seek to develop; and
- 215 (e) Specific minority enterprise assistance and
- 216 development programs that would be needed and recommended.
- 217 **SECTION 11.** (1) Part V of the economic development plan
- 218 shall consist of recommendations. The recommendations shall be
- 219 based on Part IV of the plan and shall seek to improve in every
- 220 possible and feasible manner the coordination and implementation
- 221 of all activities and programs outlined and identified as required
- 222 in Part III of the plan.
- 223 (2) The plan shall make recommendations regarding new
- 224 initiatives and new programs and the alteration or expansion of
- 225 existing programs as deemed necessary to achieve the goals
- 226 established. The recommendations shall state specifically what is
- 227 to be done, who is to do it and how it is to be done and shall
- 228 also set out the cost benefits of each recommendation.
- 229 (3) The office, in consultation with the task force and the
- 230 Mississippi Development Authority, shall develop a legislative

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- 232 goals established in the state long-range plan for economic
- 233 development. The legislative package shall be prepared and
- 234 presented in bill format.
- 235 **SECTION 12.** All parts of the plan shall be completed no
- 236 later than December 1, 2006. A preliminary report on the status
- 237 of the plan shall be made to the Joint Legislative Budget
- 238 Committee in November 2006.
- 239 **SECTION 13.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 240 and after July 1, 2006.
