HOUSE BILL NO. 1109

AN ACT TO CREATE NEW CODE SECTION 75-35-8, MISSISSIPPI CODE 1 OF 1972, TO ESTABLISH HUMANE METHODS OF SLAUGHTERING; TO AMEND SECTION 75-35-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE 2 3 4 COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE TO EXAMINE AND INSPECT FOR METHODS OF SLAUGHTERING AND TO PROVIDE FOR SUSPENSION OF 5 б INSPECTION SERVICES WHERE ANIMALS ARE BEING SLAUGHTERED IN AN 7 INHUMANE MANNER UNTIL THE ESTABLISHMENT OFFERS SATISFACTORY 8 ASSURANCES OF COMPLIANCE; TO AMEND SECTION 75-35-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT NO PERSON SHALL SLAUGHTER CERTAIN 9 ANIMALS IN AN INHUMANE MANNER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 SECTION 1. The following section shall be codified as Section 75-35-8, Mississippi Code of 1972: 13 75-35-8. (1) For purposes of this chapter, the following 14 methods of slaughtering and handling are declared to be humane: 15 In the case of cattle, calves, horses, mules, 16 (a) sheep, swine, ratites, nontraditional livestock, rabbits and other 17 livestock, all animals are to be rendered insensible to pain by a 18 19 single blow or gunshot or by an electrical, chemical or other means which is rapid and effective before being shackled, hoisted, 20 21 thrown, cast or cut; or 22 (b) By slaughtering and handling in connection with such slaughtering in accordance with the ritual requirements of 23 24 the Jewish faith or any other religious faith that prescribes a method of slaughter whereby the animal suffers loss of 25 26 consciousness by anemia of the brain caused by the simultaneous and instantaneous severance of the carotid arteries with a sharp 27 28 instrument. 29 (2) In addition to the methods prescribed in subsection (1) 30 of this section, the commissioner may designate as humane any

by the United States Secretary of Agriculture on or before April 32 33 7, 1981, pursuant to United States Code Section 7-1904. The 34 commissioner is further authorized to designate as humane other 35 methods of slaughtering and handling which have been demonstrated 36 by research, investigation and experimentation to be humane with 37 reference to the speed and scope of slaughtering operations and with reference to other existing methods and then current 38 39 scientific knowledge.

40 **SECTION 2.** Section 75-35-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 41 amended as follows:

42 75-35-7. (a) For the purpose of preventing the use in intrastate commerce, as hereinafter provided, of meat and meat 43 44 food products which are adulterated, the commissioner shall cause to be made, by inspectors appointed for that purpose, an 45 examination and inspection of all cattle, sheep, swine, goats, 46 horses, mules, and other equine before they shall be allowed to 47 48 enter into any slaughtering, packing, meat canning, rendering, or 49 similar establishment in this state in which slaughtering and preparation of meat and meat food products of such animals are 50 51 conducted; and all cattle, sheep, swine, goats, horses, mules, and 52 other equine found on such inspection to show symptoms of disease 53 shall be set apart and slaughtered separately from all other cattle, sheep, swine, goats, horses, mules, or other equine, and 54 when so slaughtered, the carcasses of said cattle, sheep, swine, 55 goats, horses, mules, or other equine shall be subject to a 56 careful examination and inspection, all as provided by the rules 57 58 and regulations to be prescribed by the commissioner as herein provided for. 59

(b) For the purpose of preventing the inhumane
slaughtering of livestock, the commissioner shall cause to be
made, by inspectors appointed for that purpose, an examination and
inspection of the method by which cattle, sheep, swine, ratites,
nontraditional livestock, rabbits, goats, horses, mules and other

78 SECTION 3. Section 75-35-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
79 amended as follows:

80 75-35-21. No person, firm, or corporation shall, with 81 respect to any cattle, sheep, swine, goats, horses, mules, or 82 other <u>equine</u>, or any carcasses, parts of carcasses, meat or meat 83 food products of any such animals:

84 (a) Slaughter any such animals or prepare any such
85 products which are capable of use as human food, at any
86 establishment preparing such articles, except in compliance with
87 the requirements of this chapter;

(b) Sell, transport, offer for sale or transportation, 88 89 or receive for transportation, in intrastate commerce, (i) any 90 such products which (1.) are capable of use as human food, and 91 (2.) are adulterated or misbranded at the time of such sale, transportation, offer for sale or transportation, or receipt for 92 transportation; or (ii) any items required to be inspected under 93 this article unless they have been so inspected and passed; 94 95 (c) Do, with respect to any such items which are 96 capable of use as human food, any act while they are being 97 transported in intrastate commerce or held for sale after such *HR03/R1329* H. 98 transportation, which is intended to cause or has the effect of 99 causing such items to be adulterated or misbranded;

100 (d) Slaughter or handle in connection with such

101 slaughter any such animals in any manner not declared to be humane

102 under Section 75-35-8.

103 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 104 and after July 1, 2006.
