HOUSE BILL NO. 1202 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT HUMAN CLONING; TO PROHIBIT SHIPPING OR 1 RECEIVING EMBRYOS PRODUCED BY HUMAN CLONING; TO DEFINE CERTAIN 2 TERMS; TO PROVIDE CRIMINAL AND CIVIL PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT; TO CREATE THE STEM CELL RESEARCH ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND 3 4 PROVIDE FOR ITS DUTIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5

б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

7 SECTION 1. This act may be cited as the "Human Cloning

Prohibition Act of 2006." 8

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SECTION 2. As used in this act:

(a) "Human cloning" means human asexual reproduction, 10 accomplished by introducing the genetic material from one or more 11 human somatic cells into a fertilized or unfertilized oocyte whose 12 nuclear material has been removed or inactivated so as to produce 13 14 a living organism at any stage of development with a human or predominantly human genetic constitution. 15

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(b) "Somatic cell" means a cell having a complete set of chromosomes obtained from a living or deceased human body at 17 any stage of development. 18

19 (c) "Embryo" means an organism of the species Homo 20 sapiens from the single cell stage to eight (8) weeks development.

21 (d) "Fetus" means an organism of the species Homo 22 sapiens from eight (8) weeks development until complete expulsion or extraction from a woman's body, or removal from an artificial 23 womb or other similar environment designed to nurture the 24 development of such organism. 25

SECTION 3. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or 26 27 entity, public or private, to intentionally or knowingly:

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(a) Perform or attempt to perform human cloning;

(b) Participate in an attempt to perform human cloning;
(c) Transfer or receive the product of human cloning
for any purpose; <u>this subsection shall not apply to any person who</u>
<u>has received a product of human cloning as a part of a medical</u>
<u>treatment in a jurisdiction where such treatment is lawful;</u> or

34 (d) Transfer or receive, in whole or in part, any
35 oocyte, embryo, fetus or human somatic cell for the purpose of
36 human cloning.

37 (2) (a) Any person or entity that violates any provision of 38 this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction 39 thereof, shall be fined not more than Ten Thousand Dollars 40 (\$10,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 41 one (1) year, or both.

(b) Any person or entity that violates any provision of this section shall be subject to, in the case of a violation that involves the derivation of a pecuniary gain, a civil penalty of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and not more than an amount equal to the amount of the gross gain multiplied by two (2), if that amount is greater than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

(3) Nothing in this statute shall restrict areas of scientific research not specifically prohibited by this statute, including in vitro fertilization, the administration of fertility enhancing drugs, research in the use of nuclear transfer or other cloning techniques to produce molecules, DNA, tissues, organs, plants, or animals other than humans, or cells other than human embryos.

**SECTION 4.** (1) It is the intent of the Legislature that the 56 57 sanctity and dignity of human life should be a paramount concern of all. To further that end, this legislation establishes a "Stem 58 Cell Research Advisory Committee." This committee shall consist 59 60 of an appointee of the Dean of the University of Mississippi Medical School, an appointee of the Governor, an appointee of the 61 \*HR40/R815PH\* H. B. 62 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and an appointee of the 63 Lieutenant Governor. The Chaplain of the University Medical 64 Center shall serve as an advisory ex officio member of the 65 committee.

66 (2) The duties of this advisory committee will be to examine the state of research in Mississippi concerning human stem cells, 67 cloning of human cells, human embryos and human oocytes. The 68 69 chairman of this advisory committee shall convene meetings of the committee at such times as the chairman feels are necessary to 70 produce a report for the Legislature and Governor before July 71 72 2007. The chairman of the committee will be the person appointed by the Dean of the University of Mississippi Medical School. 73

74 (3) It is the intent of the Legislature that any funds
75 appropriated by the Legislature to support medical research be
76 used to support research that improves life and combats disease.
77 No state appropriated funds may be used to support research banned
78 by this act.

79 (4) This section shall stand repealed on July 2, 2007.
80 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from
81 and after July 1, 2006.
