## HOUSE BILL NO. 1242

AN ACT RELATING TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION; TO AMEND 1 SECTION 37-21-55, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE FROM THE 2 3 DUTIES OF THE INTERAGENCY ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD 4 SERVICES THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ADVISING AND MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS 5 TO THE EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES INTERAGENCY COORDINATING COUNCIL, б TO AUTHORIZE THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO DIRECT STATE ENTITIES 7 HAVING EARLY CHILDHOOD RESPONSIBILITIES TO BE COORDINATED THROUGH 8 THE DIVISION OF FAMILY AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES WITHIN THE 9 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, AND TO REQUIRE THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO ASSESS THE EDUCATIONAL COMPONENTS OF THE STATE'S 10 11 TIERED REIMBURSEMENT STRUCTURE FOR CHILD CARE FACILITIES; TO BRING FORWARD SECTIONS 37-21-51 AND 37-21-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 12 WHICH RELATE TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND THE EARLY CHILDHOOD 13 SERVICES INTERAGENCY COORDINATING COUNCIL, FOR PURPOSES OF 14 15 POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-21-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

19 37-21-55. (1) The Interagency Advisory Committee for Early 20 Childhood Services is created to develop and make recommendations 21 to the Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council 22 established under Section 37-21-53 as deemed necessary to 23 implement the council's responsibilities relating to all programs 24 serving preschool children and their families in Mississippi.

(2) The membership of the Interagency Advisory Committee forEarly Childhood Services shall be as follows:

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(a) The Chairmen of the Senate Education, Public Health and Welfare and Appropriations Committees, or their Senate

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(c) A representative of the Governor;

No. 1242 \*HRO3/R1489\* 06/HR03/R1489 PAGE 2 (RKM\LH) 66 A representative of an advocacy organization (x) 67 appointed by the Speaker of the House; and 68 (xi) A representative of a community or junior 69 college early childhood program appointed by the Governor; 70 (j) A parent of a preschool-age child appointed by the 71 Governor; 72 (k) A parent of a preschool-age child with special 73 needs appointed by the Speaker of the House; 74 A representative of the cooperative extension (1)75 services appointed by the President of the Senate; 76 A physician who is a member of the Mississippi (m) 77 Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, appointed by the 78 Director of the University Medical Center; 79 The Director of the Mississippi Public Education (n) Forum, or his designee; and 80 81 The Executive Director of the Mississippi Economic (0) Council, or his designee. 82 83 To the extent possible, any representative of a state agency designated to serve on the Interagency Advisory Committee shall be 84 85 the same individual designated to assist the Interagency 86 Coordinating Council in performing its duties and 87 responsibilities. The advisory committee shall meet upon call of the Early 88 (3) 89 Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council before August 90 1, 2000, and the council shall appoint a chairman from among the membership of the advisory committee. The chairman shall serve 91 92 for a one-year term and may be reappointed for subsequent terms. The advisory committee shall adopt internal organizational 93 procedures necessary for efficient operation of the advisory 94 committee and may establish subcommittees for conducting specific 95 96 programs and activities. Advisory committee procedures must 97 include duties of officers, a process for selecting officers, 98 duties of subcommittees, quorum requirements for conducting \*HR03/R1489\* H. B. 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business and policies for any staff. The members of the Early 99 100 Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council shall designate necessary staff of their departments to assist the 101 102 advisory committee in performing its duties and responsibilities. 103 The advisory committee shall meet and conduct business at least 104 quarterly. Quarterly meetings of the advisory committee shall be open to the public, and opportunity for public comment must be 105 106 made available at each meeting. The staff of the advisory 107 committee shall notify all persons who request such notice as to 108 the date, time and place of each meeting.

109 (4) The Interagency Advisory Committee for Early Childhood 110 Services, in addition to responsibilities assigned by the Early 111 Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council, shall perform 112 each of the following duties:

(a) Assist in the implementation of the study conducted by the Task Force on the Development and Implementation of Comprehensive Early Childhood Services in Mississippi established under Laws, 1999, Chapter 584;

(b) Identify services to children which impact earlychildhood development and education;

(c) Identify and recommend methods to facilitate interagency coordination of service programs for preschool children; and

122 (d) Serve as a forum for information exchange regarding 123 recommendations and priorities in early childhood development and 124 education. \* \* \*

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126 (5) The Interagency Advisory Committee for Early Childhood
 127 Services, with the consent of a majority of its members, may
 128 direct any state entity with early childhood responsibilities to
 129 be coordinated through the Division of Family and Children's
 130 Services within the Department of Human Services for the purposes

(6) Beginning on July 1, 2006, the Interagency Advisory 133 134 Committee for Early Childhood Services shall meet at the direction 135 of the Director of the Division of Family and Children's Services 136 to assess the appropriate criteria for determining and implementing the educational components of the state's tiered 137 reimbursement structure for child care facilities. 138 139 SECTION 2. Section 37-21-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 140 brought forward as follows: 141 37-21-51. (1) As used in Sections 37-21-51 through 37-21-55, the term "preschool children" means any children who 142 143 have not entered kindergarten. 144 To ensure that all children have access to quality early (2) childhood education and development services, the Legislature 145 146 finds and declares the following: 147 (a) Parents have the primary duty to educate their

148 young preschool children;

(b) The State of Mississippi can assist and educate
parents in their role as the primary caregivers and educators of
young preschool children; and

(c) There is a need to explore innovative approaches
and strategies for aiding parents and families in the education
and development of young preschool children.

155 SECTION 3. Section 37-21-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
156 brought forward as follows:

157 37-21-53. (1) The Early Childhood Services Interagency 158 Coordinating Council is created to ensure coordination among the 159 various agencies and programs serving preschool children in order 160 to support school district's efforts to achieve the goal of 161 readiness to start school, to facilitate communication, 162 cooperation and maximum use of resources and to promote high

Council procedures must include duties of officers, a 188 189 process for selecting officers, quorum requirements for conducting 190 business and policies for any council staff. Each member of the council shall designate necessary staff of their departments to 191 192 assist the council in performing its duties and responsibilities. 193 The council shall meet and conduct business at least twice 194 annually. 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196 meeting. The chairman of the council shall notify all persons who 197 request such notice as to the date, time and place of each 198 meeting.

199 (4) The Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating200 Council shall perform each of the following duties:

(a) Serve as interagency coordinating council for the
various agencies and public and private programs serving preschool
children and their families in the State of Mississippi;

204 (b) Advise the State Board of Health, State Board of Education, Department of Human Services, State Department of 205 206 Mental Health, Division of Medicaid, State Department of 207 Rehabilitation Services and any other appropriate agency of 208 standards, rules, rule revisions, agency guidelines and 209 administration affecting child care facilities, prekindergarten 210 programs, family training programs and other programs and services 211 for preschool children and families;

(c) Collect, compile and distribute data relating to all programs and services for preschool children and families, including, but not limited to, an inventory of the programs and services available in each county of the state, and identify and make recommendations with regard to program areas for which an unfulfilled need exists within the state for accurate and accessible information;

(d) Review and analyze spending priorities for each state agency that utilizes state or federal funds in the administration or provision of programs and services for preschool children and make recommendations thereon to the Legislative Budget Committee and the Governor;

(e) Publish annually, before November 1, a
comprehensive report on the status of all programs and services
for preschool children in Mississippi and distribute the report to
the Governor, the Legislature and local school districts and make

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228 the report available to the general public, using the following 229 criteria:

230 Program name and location; (i) 231 (ii) Dates of operation; 232 (iii) Services provided; 233 (iv) Target population and number served; 234 (v) Eligibility requirements; 235 (vi) Funding sources; 236 (vii) Amount of funding per unit; (viii) Annual cost; 237 238 (ix) Evaluation type and results; and 239 The state agency administering the program. (x) Receive and consider recommendations of the 240 (f) 241 Interagency Advisory Committee for Early Childhood Services established in Section 37-21-55; and 242 243 Apply for, receive and administer funds for (a) administration, research, pilot, planning and evaluation of all 244 245 programs serving preschool children and their families. 246 If any agency represented on the Early Childhood (5) Services Interagency Coordinating Council includes a request for 247 248 funding for the support of the council in the agency's annual 249 budget request presented to the Legislative Budget Committee, the 250 Early Childhood Services Interagency Coordinating Council shall be abolished, effective on the date that the agency presents its 251 252 budget request. 253 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 254 and after July 1, 2006.

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
