HOUSE BILL NO. 1266

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-5-303, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO REQUIRE ENHANCED 911 SERVICES (E-911) TO INCLUDE THE DISPLAY OF 2 A CALLER'S COUNTY AND CITY WHEN SUCH CALLER DIALS E-911; TO AMEND 3 SECTION 19-5-319, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: б 7 SECTION 1. Section 19-5-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 9 19-5-303. For purposes of Sections 19-5-301 through 19-5-317, the following words and terms shall have the following 10 meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 11 (a) "Exchange access facilities" shall mean all lines 12 13 provided by the service supplier for the provision of local 14 exchange service as defined in existing general subscriber services tariffs. 15 (b) "Tariff rate" shall mean the rate or rates billed 16 by a service supplier as stated in the service supplier's tariffs 17 and approved by the Public Service Commission, which represent the 18 19 service supplier's recurring charges for exchange access facilities, exclusive of all taxes, fees, licenses or similar 20 21 charges whatsoever. (c) "District" shall mean any communications district 22 23 created pursuant to Sections 19-5-301 et seq., or by local and 24 private act of the State of Mississippi. (d) "Service supplier" shall mean any person providing 25 exchange telephone service to any service user throughout the 26 27 county.

(e) "Service user" shall mean any person, not otherwise
exempt from taxation, who is provided exchange telephone service
in the county or state.

31 (f) "E911" shall mean Enhanced Universal Emergency 32 Number Service or Enhanced 911 Service, which is a telephone 33 exchange communications service whereby a Public Safety Answering 34 Point (PSAP) designated by the county or local communications district may receive telephone calls dialed to the telephone 35 number 911. E911 Service includes lines and equipment necessary 36 for the answering, transferring and dispatching of public 37 38 emergency telephone calls originated by persons within the serving area who dial 911. Enhanced 911 Service shall include the 39 40 displaying of the name, address, county and municipality from where the caller is placing the call, and other pertinent caller 41 information as may be supplied by the service supplier. 42

(g) "Basic 911" shall mean a telephone service
terminated in designated Public Safety Answering Points accessible
by the public through telephone calls dialed to the telephone
number 911. Basic 911 is a voice service and does not display
address or telephone number information.

"Shared tenant services (STS)" shall mean any 48 (h) 49 telephone service operation supplied by a party other than a regulated local exchange telephone service supplier for which a 50 charge is levied. Such services shall include, but not be limited 51 52 to, apartment building systems, hospital systems, office building systems and other systems where dial tone is derived from 53 54 connection of tariffed telephone trunks or lines connected to a 55 private branch exchange telephone system.

(i) "Private branch exchange (PBX)" shall mean any telephone service operation supplied by a party other than a regulated local exchange telephone service supplier for which a charge is not levied. Such services are those where tariffed telephone trunks or lines are terminated into a central switch H. B. No. 1266 *HR40/R1818* 06/HR40/R1818

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61 which is used to supply dial tone to telephones operating within 62 that system.

(j) "Off-premise extension" shall mean any telephone
connected to a private branch exchange or a shared tenant service
which is in a different building or location from the main
switching equipment and, therefore, has a different physical
address.

68 (k) "Centrex" or "ESSX" shall mean any variety of 69 services offered in connection with any tariffed telephone service 70 in which switching services and other dialing features are 71 provided by the regulated local exchange telephone service 72 supplier.

"Commercial mobile radio service" or "CMRS" shall 73 (1) mean commercial mobile radio service under Sections 3(27) and 74 75 332(d) of the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996, 47 USCS 76 Section 151 et seq., and the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993, Public Law 103-66. The term includes the term "wireless" 77 78 and service provided by any wireless real time two-way voice communication device, including radio-telephone communications 79 80 used in cellular telephone service, personal communication 81 service, or the functional or competitive equivalent of a 82 radio-telephone communications line used in cellular telephone service, a personal communication service, or a network radio 83 84 access line. The term does not include service whose customers do 85 not have access to 911 or to a 911-like service, to a communication channel suitable only for data transmission, to a 86 87 wireless roaming service or other nonlocal radio access line 88 service, or to a private telecommunications system.

(m) "Telecommunicator" shall mean any person engaged in or employed as a telecommunications operator by any public safety, fire or emergency medical agency whose primary responsibility is the receipt or processing of calls for emergency services provided by public safety, fire or emergency medical agencies or the H. 06/HR40/R1818 PAGE 3 (OM\BD) 94 dispatching of emergency services provided by public safety, fire 95 or emergency medical agencies and who receives or disseminates 96 information relative to emergency assistance by telephone or 97 radio.

98 (n) "Public safety answering point (PSAP)" shall mean 99 any point of contact between the public and the emergency services 100 such as a 911 answering point or, in the absence of 911 emergency 101 telephone service, any other point of contact where emergency 102 telephone calls are routinely answered and dispatched or 103 transferred to another agency.

104 (o) "Local exchange telephone service" shall mean all
105 lines provided by a service supplier as defined in existing
106 general subscriber tariffs.

107 SECTION 2. Section 19-5-319, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 108 amended as follows:

109 19-5-319. (1) Automatic number identification (ANI), 110 automatic location identification (ALI) and geographic automatic 111 location identification (GeoALI) information that consist of the name, address, which shall include the county and municipality 112 113 from where the caller is placing the call, and telephone number of telephone or wireless subscribers shall be confidential, and the 114 115 dissemination of the information contained in the 911 automatic number and location data base is prohibited except for the 116 117 following purpose: the information will be provided to the Public 118 Safety Answering Point (PSAP) on a call-by-call basis only for the purpose of handling emergency calls or for training, and any 119 120 permanent record of the information shall be secured by the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) and disposed of in a manner which 121 will retain that security, except upon court order or subpoena 122 from a court of competent jurisdiction or as otherwise provided by 123 124 law.

(2) All emergency telephone calls and telephone call
 transmissions received pursuant to Section 19-5-301 et seq., and

No. 1266 *H 06/HR40/R1818 PAGE 4 (OM\BD) 127 all recordings of the emergency telephone calls, shall remain 128 confidential and shall be used only for the purposes as may be 129 needed for law enforcement, fire, medical rescue or other 130 emergency services. These recordings shall not be released to any 131 other parties without court order or subpoena from a court of 132 competent jurisdiction.

(3) PSAP and emergency response entities shall maintain and, 133 upon request, release a record of the date of call, time of call, 134 the time the emergency response entity was notified, and the 135 136 identity of the emergency response entity. The emergency response 137 entity shall maintain and, upon request, release a record of the date and time the call was received by the emergency response 138 139 entity and the time the emergency response entity arrived on the 140 scene. Requests for release of records must be made in writing and must specify the information desired. Requestors shall pay 141 the cost of providing the information requested in accordance with 142 143 the Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983, Section 25-61-1 et 144 seq. The identity of any caller or person or persons who are the subject of any call, or the address, phone number or other 145 146 identifying information about any such person, shall not be released except as provided in subsection (2) of this section. 147

148SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from149and after July 1, 2006.
