HOUSE BILL NO. 1323

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT ANY PERSON WHO OWNS A RESIDENTIAL 1 2 STRUCTURE IN HANCOCK, HARRISON OR JACKSON COUNTY THAT WAS 3 DESTROYED BY HURRICANE KATRINA AND THAT WAS LOCATED ON PROPERTY 4 THAT DOES NOT MEET THE CURRENT LOCAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MINIMUM SIZE OF A LOT FOR A RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE, SHALL BE AUTHORIZED TO 5 HAVE A NEW RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE CONSTRUCTED ON THE PROPERTY 6 7 WITHOUT HAVING TO MEET THE CURRENT LOCAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE 8 MINIMUM SIZE OF A LOT, UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS; AND FOR RELATED 9 PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 11 SECTION 1. Any person who owns a residential structure in Hancock, Harrison or Jackson County that was destroyed by 12 Hurricane Katrina and that was located on property that does not 13 14 meet the current requirements of the county or municipality in 15 which the property is located for the minimum size of a lot for a 16 residential structure, shall be authorized to have a new 17 residential structure constructed on the property without having to meet the current requirements of the county or municipality for 18 the minimum size of a lot for a residential structure, provided 19 20 that: (a) the square footage of the new residential structure is 21 not greater than the square footage of the residential structure 22 that was destroyed; (b) the use and purpose of the property will remain the same as it was before Hurricane Katrina; and (c) the 23 24 construction of the new residential structure is begun before September 1, 2007. 25

26 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 27 and after its passage.
