HOUSE BILL NO. 1324

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE JOHN C. STENNIS INSTITUTE OF GOVERNMENT 1 AT MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY TO CONDUCT A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY 2 3 OF THE PERFORMANCE OF FIRST RESPONDERS TO HURRICANE KATRINA; TO 4 ESTABLISH CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES FOR COMPLETING A FINAL REPORT OF THE STUDY TO THE LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED 5 б PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares the following: 8 9 (a) On August 29, 2005, Hurricane Katrina devastated 10 the Mississippi Gulf Coast, causing loss of life and property; During and after the disaster, many persons became 11 (b) concerned about the quality and sufficiency of the emergency 12 response provided by instrumentalities of the federal, state and 13 local governments, as well as private entities that responded to 14 the disaster; and 15 The Legislature believes a neutral and 16 (C) 17 comprehensive review of the response to the disaster must be conducted to assist in preparing for future disasters. 18 SECTION 2. (1) The John C. Stennis Institute of Government 19 20 at Mississippi State University shall conduct a comprehensive study of the response of all first responders to the devastation 21 22 caused by Hurricane Katrina. This study shall consist of the following components: 23 24 (a) A focused review of the interoperability of communications systems used by first responders, the adequacy of 25 preparations for the provision of care made by health care 26 27 facilities, and the integration of emergency and recovery planning by public and private entities involved in emergency response and 28 29 planning; *HR07/R1322* H. 30 (b) Any other matter or condition that may have been a 31 significant cause that affected the quality and sufficiency of 32 emergency responders' performance in the wake of Hurricane 33 Katrina;

34 (c) A full and complete analysis of all issues related 35 to the response to Hurricane Katrina and a plan of recommended 36 legislative and administrative action, organized by highest to 37 lowest priority, necessary to correct deficiencies cited in the 38 report; and

39 (d) A statement of fiscal impact showing the costs to
40 state and local government associated with the implementation of
41 any recommendations.

42 (2) All agencies of state and local government, and all 43 not-for-profit corporations that receive funds appropriated by the 44 Legislature or any local governing authority for any purpose 45 through grant or contract with any state agency or local governing 46 authority, shall fully cooperate with the efforts of the institute 47 in preparing its report.

SECTION 3. (1) The John C. Stennis Institute of Government 48 49 at Mississippi State University shall prepare a final report of the study required by this act to the Legislature to be delivered 50 51 no later than December 31, 2006. During the course of the report, the institute shall report to the Joint Committee on Performance 52 Evaluation and Expenditure Review (PEER) on the progress it has 53 54 achieved in meeting the requirements of this act. The first report shall be delivered no later than July 1, 2006, and shall 55 56 detail the institute's progress in preparing a comprehensive plan 57 for accomplishing the purposes of this act. The second report shall be made to PEER no later than October 31, 2006, detailing 58 the progress the institute has made toward implementing its plan. 59 60 (2) Reports required in subsection (1) of this section may 61 be made in a manner mutually acceptable to the institute and PEER.
