HOUSE BILL NO. 1331

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 5-1-41, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROVIDE THAT EACH SENATOR AND REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LEGISLATURE 2 SHALL RECEIVE AS COMPENSATION AN AMOUNT ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE 3 PERSONNEL BOARD; TO AMEND SECTION 5-1-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE SALARY OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR AND 4 5 б SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL BE AN AMOUNT 7 ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE PERSONNEL BOARD; TO AMEND SECTION 5-1-45, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE PRESIDENT PRO 8 9 TEMPORE OF THE SENATE SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY IN AN AMOUNT ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE PERSONNEL BOARD; TO AMEND SECTION 5-1-46, 10 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE SALARY OF THE 11 SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL BE 12 ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE PERSONNEL BOARD; TO AMEND SECTION $5-1-47\,,$ MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT EACH SENATOR AND 13 14 REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LEGISLATURE AND THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR 15 16 SHALL RECEIVE AN EXPENSE ALLOWANCE IN AN AMOUNT ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE PERSONNEL BOARD; TO AMEND SECTION 5-1-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 17 18

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 20 SECTION 1. Section 5-1-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 21

5-1-41. Beginning with the 2007 Regular Session of the 22 23 Legislature of the State of Mississippi, each Senator and Representative of the Legislature shall receive as compensation at 24 25 each regular session an amount established by the State Personnel Board and the mileage allowance provided by Section 25-3-41, for 26 each mile of the distance by the most direct route usually 27 traveled in coming to and returning from the place where the 28 Legislature sits. Beginning on April 16, 2007, each Senator and 29 Representative shall receive for attending each extraordinary 30 session or called session an amount established by the State 31 Personnel Board and mileage at the same rate as per regular 32 33 session. In addition to the above, beginning on April 16, 2007, each Senator and Representative and the Lieutenant Governor shall 34 35 receive an amount established by the State Personnel Board for *HR07/R1416* H. 36 expenses incidental to <u>such</u> office for every full month of <u>the</u> 37 <u>Senator's or Representative's</u> term, except any month or major 38 fraction thereof when the Legislature is convened in regular or 39 extraordinary session; and payments shall be made to each Senator 40 and Representative and the Lieutenant Governor by the State 41 Treasurer between the first and tenth day of each month following 42 the month for which the payments are due.

43 SECTION 2. Section 5-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
44 amended as follows:

5-1-43. (1) <u>Beginning July 1, 2006</u>, the salary of the
Lieutenant Governor and of the Speaker of the House of
Representatives shall be <u>an amount established by the State</u>
<u>Personnel Board</u>, and they shall receive for attending each
extraordinary or called session the same compensation and mileage
as is provided for members of the Legislature. * * *

51 (2) On the first day of each month, the Lieutenant Governor 52 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall receive in 53 twelve (12) equal monthly installments the compensation provided 54 for pursuant to subsection (1) of this section.

55 SECTION 3. Section 5-1-45, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 56 amended as follows:

57 5-1-45. Beginning on <u>July 1, 2006</u>, the President Pro Tempore 58 of the Senate shall receive an annual salary in an amount 59 <u>established by the State Personnel Board</u>. The salary provided for 60 the President Pro Tempore under this section shall be in addition 61 to the compensation and expense allowance established for members 62 of the Legislature under Section 5-1-41.

63 **SECTION 4.** Section 5-1-46, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 64 amended as follows:

65 5-1-46. Beginning on June 4, 1997, the Speaker Pro Tempore 66 of the House of Representatives shall receive an annual salary in 67 an amount <u>established by the State Personnel Board</u>. The salary 68 provided for the Speaker Pro Tempore under this section shall be H. B. No. 1331 *HR07/R1416* 06/HR07/R1416 PAGE 2 (GT\HS) 69 in addition to the compensation and expense allowance established70 for members of the Legislature under Section 5-1-41.

71 SECTION 5. Section 5-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 72 amended as follows:

73 5-1-47. (1) In addition to the regular salary and mileage 74 provided by law, an expense allowance in an amount established by the State Personnel Board for each legislative day in actual 75 76 attendance at a session shall be paid to the Lieutenant Governor 77 and members of the Senate and House of Representatives, together 78 with an additional mileage allowance as provided by Section 79 25-3-41, for each mile of the distance by the most direct route usually traveled in coming to and returning from the place where 80 81 the Legislature is in session, which said expense allowance and additional mileage allowance shall be paid at the end of each 82 seven (7) day period while the Legislature is in session. 83

In addition to the mileage allowance provided for in the above paragraph, an expense allowance <u>in an amount established by</u> the State Personnel Board shall be paid to the Lieutenant Governor and members of the Senate and House of Representatives *** * *** for any day between legislative sessions while attending to legislative duties, upon the approval of the appropriate management committee of the Senate or House, as the case may be.

The expense allowance and additional mileage allowance 91 (2)provided by this section for the Lieutenant Governor and members 92 93 of the Senate shall be paid from the appropriate legislative fund of the Senate as provided by law, and the expense allowance and 94 95 additional mileage allowance for members of the House of Representatives shall be paid from the appropriate legislative 96 97 fund of said House of Representatives as provided by law, upon warrants drawn for such purpose in the manner provided by law. 98 SECTION 6. Section 5-1-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 99 100 amended as follows:

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5-1-51. * * * The mileage and one-third (1/3) of the salary 101 102 for a regular session may be received at the beginning of the session. After thirty (30) days of the session have expired 103 104 another one-third (1/3) may be received and the remainder at the 105 close of the session. Provided that the remaining one-third (1/3)106 of their salaries of any regular session and the remainder of the unpaid salary of the * * * President Pro Tempore of the Senate 107 * * * be payable immediately upon both houses terminating the 108 consideration of all bills. * * * 109

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SECTION 7. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and

117 extended.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
