HOUSE BILL NO. 1345

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A DISABLED PERSON TO WHOM A SPECIAL MOTOR VEHICLE 3 LICENSE PLATE IS ISSUED FOR THE PURPOSE OF ALLOWING SUCH PERSON 4 SPECIAL PARKING PRIVILEGES MAY RETAIN THE SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE AND RENEW IT ANNUALLY WITHOUT BEING REQUIRED TO SUBMIT AN 5 ADDITIONAL CERTIFICATION OF A PHYSICIAN THAT THE APPLICANT MEETS 6 7 THE DEFINITION OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES; AND FOR RELATED 8 PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11 amended as follows:

27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the 12 State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 13 ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue 14 through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing 15 the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation 16 International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on 17 18 Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial 19 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 20 licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of 21 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 22 walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant 23 will have the disability for at least five (5) years. The State 24 25 Tax Commission shall prepare and issue to the tax collectors of the various counties, decals for placement on the special license 26 plates. The decals shall bear thereon the month in which the 27 28 license plate was issued and the year in which the special license plate will expire. attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section 31 32 27-19-31(1). A person to whom the special license plate is issued may retain the special license plate and may renew it annually 33 without being required to submit an additional certification of a 34 35 licensed physician, upon complying with the motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles, and upon 36 payment of all taxes and fees prescribed by law for private 37 carriers of passengers, pickup trucks and other noncommercial 38 motor vehicles. If an applicant fails to renew the special 39 40 license plate before its date of expiration, then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county tax collector 41 and the tax collector shall issue to such person a regular license 42 plate to replace the special license plate. 43 The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this 44 section, includes motorcycles. 45 The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 46 47 ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons who, as determined by a licensed physician: 48 Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping 49 (a) 50 to rest; or Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from, 51 (b) 52 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive device; or 53 Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent 54 (C) 55 that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1) 56 57 liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60) 58 mm/hg on room air at rest; or 59 (d) Use portable oxygen; or 60 Have a cardiac condition to the extent that the (e) 61 person's functional limitations are classified in severity as 62 Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American 63 Heart Association; or *HR12/R1712* H. 64 (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due65 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.

An applicant for a special license plate bearing the International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.

The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable 72 (2)73 windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and 74 periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. 75 The 76 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through 77 the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. The initial application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 78 79 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of 80 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to These placards shall be valid for the period of time that 81 walk. the license tag attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant 82 83 to Section 27-19-31(1) and may be renewed in the same manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates under 84 85 subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard or by 86 87 hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle. The State Tax 88 Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles.

The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance 89 (3) 90 of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application 91 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by 92 to walk. this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and 93 94 shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices 95 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the 96 *HR12/R1712*

97 certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the 98 definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 99 ability to walk. The certification shall also include the period 100 of time that the physician determines the applicant will have the 101 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable 102 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the 103 vehicle. The temporary removable windshield placard shall be 104 valid for a period of time for which the physician has determined 105 that the applicant will have the disability, not to exceed six (6) 106 107 months from the date of issuance. The State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles. 108

109 (4) The removable windshield placard and the temporary110 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include:

(a) The International Symbol of Access, which is at least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be white on a red shield);

(b) An identification number and, on the reverse side,the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;

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(c) A date of expiration; and

119 (d) The seal of the State of Mississippi.

(5) 120 (a) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an 121 area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle does not (i) have displayed the removable windshield placard 122 123 authorized in this section with the date of expiration visible, 124 (ii) have the special license plate issued under this section properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, or (iii) have the 125 126 disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 127 27-19-53 properly displayed upon the motor vehicle. Any person 128 who unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in such areas, or who blocks 129 such spaces or access thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor H. B. No. 1345 *HR12/R1712*

For the third 132 and subsequent offenses under this section, the offender's 133 driver's license shall be suspended for ninety (90) days by the 134 Commissioner of Public Safety in accordance with Section 63-1-53 135 in addition to any fine imposed. The court shall not suspend or 136 reduce any fine required to be imposed under this subsection.

(b) A person who is charged with a violation of this 137 section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for 138 139 persons who are disabled and failing properly to display (i) a 140 removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle, (ii) a special 141 142 license plate issued under this section upon the vehicle or (iii) a disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 143 27-19-53 upon the vehicle shall not be convicted and shall have 144 the charge dismissed upon presentation to the court of proof by 145 146 means of sworn oral testimony or sworn affidavit that at the time 147 of the charged violation he or a passenger in the vehicle possessed a valid removable windshield placard issued under this 148 149 section.

150 (6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special 151 license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with 152 the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the 153 certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained, 154 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be 155 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

156 (7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce 157 this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces 158 restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such 159 spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce 160 such designated parking on private property. Any owner of private 161 property may tow away a vehicle that is parked on the owner's private property in violation of the disabled parking restrictions 162 *HR12/R1712* H. B. No. 1345

06/HR12/R1712 PAGE 5 (JWB\DO) 163 set forth in this section at the vehicle owner's expense. In 164 addition, the vehicle owner may be subject to any fines or other 165 penalties provided in this section. Only areas marked in 166 accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility 167 Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces 168 shall bear the International Symbol of Access.

169 (8) Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, 170 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 171 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 172 173 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges 174 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard, 175 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and 176 is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.

177 (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
178 disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
179 the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
180 with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.
181 The identification required to park in such an area, except as
182 provided in subsection (8) of this section, is as follows:

(a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a
permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard
must be displayed or the vehicle must have a special license tag
issued under this section or Section 27-19-53 properly displayed.

(b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a
temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk,
or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary
windshield placard must be displayed.

Any person who parks in an area set aside for persons who are disabled in violation of this subsection shall be punished as provided for in subsection (5) of this section.

194 (10) Upon application by a nursing home, retirement home or195 other institution that transports disabled persons, the State Tax

NO. 1345 *HR12/R1712* 06/HR12/R1712 PAGE 6 (JWB\DO) 196 Commission may issue the special license plate authorized pursuant 197 to this section for not more than one (1) vehicle that is 198 registered in the applicant's name that is used to transport 199 disabled residents of the institution. Such institution shall 200 comply with all other laws regarding the registration of such 201 vehicle.

202 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 203 and after July 1, 2006.
