HOUSE BILL NO. 1553

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING
2 THE EXPENSES OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR FISCAL YEAR
3 2007.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8 defraying the expenses of the Office of the Attorney General for
9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007.

10 \$ 7,349,229.00.

11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Office of the
14 Attorney General which is comprised of special source funds
15 collected by or otherwise available to the office, for the purpose
16 of defraying the expenses of the office for the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007.....

18 \$ 17,007,645.00.

19 SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions
20 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:

26 For the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2006, funds are
27 provided herein to adjust the annual compensation of each employee

28 who has been employed for twelve (12) months or longer by an
29 amount equal to One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), effective on
30 July 1, 2006.

31 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
32 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
33 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
34 Services" for Fiscal Year 2008 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2007
35 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
36 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2008 budget by the
37 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
38 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
39 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
40 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
41 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
42 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
43 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2007 appropriation for "Personal
44 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.
45 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
46 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
47 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
48 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2007 "Personal Services"
49 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
50 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
51 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
52 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

53 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
54 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
55 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
56 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
57 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
58 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
59 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

60 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
61 appropriated level.

62 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
63 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
64 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
65 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

66 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
67 Office of the Attorney General shall maintain complete accounting
68 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
69 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
70 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
71 2006. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
72 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2008 shall be submitted to
73 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
74 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
75 during the Fiscal Year 2007 budget request process.

76 **SECTION 5.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
77 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
78 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
79 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
80 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
81 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
82 performance measures provided below:

128 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
129 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
130 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
131 Committee for Fiscal Year 2008.

132 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
133 Section 2, funds included therein which are derived from penalties
134 and/or other funds collected by the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit
135 shall be available for the purpose of providing the state match
136 for federal funds available for the support of the unit, or for
137 other lawful purposes as deemed appropriate by the Attorney
138 General. Further, it is the intent of the Legislature that any
139 penalties and/or other funds collected and/or expended shall be
140 accounted for separately as to source and/or application of such
141 funds.

142 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
143 Attorney General's Office charge legal fees to all agencies where
144 such legal services are provided. The Attorney General's Office
145 may contract these fees on a contract rate or an hourly rate,
146 whichever is more appropriate. Contracts with the Attorney
147 General's Office for legal services or reimbursement for hourly
148 legal services shall not require the approval of the State
149 Personnel Board. The Attorney General's Office is further
150 authorized to escalate the amount of any of its major objects of
151 expenditure in an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty
152 Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) above any amounts herein
153 authorized, and to increase the number of authorized positions in
154 order to provide the required legal services for such state
155 agencies.

156 **SECTION 8.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
157 Section 2, the amount of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
158 (\$750,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be

159 made available for expenditure by the Prosecutors Training
160 Division.

161 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
162 Attorney General's Office shall have the authority to accept,
163 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Seven Hundred
164 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00), that become available to the
165 office to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner
166 consistent with the rules and regulations of the Department of
167 Finance and Administration. None of the funds authorized in this
168 section shall be used to increase the major object of expenditure
169 "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits."

170 **SECTION 10.** No part of the money herein appropriated shall
171 be used, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of paying
172 any clerk, stenographer, assistant, deputy or other person who may
173 be related by blood or marriage within the third degree, computed
174 by the rules of civil law, to the official employing or having the
175 right of employment or selection thereof; and in the event of any
176 such payment, then the official or person approving and making or
177 receiving such payment shall be jointly and severally liable to
178 return to the State of Mississippi and to pay into the State
179 Treasury three (3) times any such amount so paid or received;
180 however, when the relationship is by affinity and the person
181 through whom the relationship was established is dead, this
182 provision shall not apply.

183 **SECTION 11.** None of the funds appropriated by this act shall
184 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or
185 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Office
186 of the Attorney General that are authorized by the Mississippi
187 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or
188 regulations that implement state or federal law.

189 **SECTION 12.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
190 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
191 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Commission on the Status

192 of Women for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
193 commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and through
194 June 30, 2007..... \$ 100,000.00.

195 This appropriation is made for the purpose of providing funds
196 to defray the expenses of the Mississippi Commission on the Status
197 of Women as established pursuant to Sections 43-59-1 through
198 43-59-14, Mississippi Code of 1972.

199 **SECTION 13.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
200 of Section 12, not more than the amounts set forth below shall be
201 expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
202 expenditure:

223 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
224 Attorney General's Office shall have the authority to accept,

225 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Four Million Five
226 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,500,000.00) that become available to
227 the office for programs that serve unmet needs of "at risk" youth
228 in the state, including, but not being limited to, Boys and Girls
229 Clubs, Big Brothers Big Sisters of America, Communities in Schools
230 and the State Coalition of Young Men's Christian Association
231 (YMCA), and to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner
232 consistent with the rules and regulations of the Department of
233 Finance and Administration. Of the funds authorized in this
234 section, not more than Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
235 (\$2,500,000.00) shall be allocated among Boys and Girls Clubs, Big
236 Brothers Big Sisters of America, and Communities in Schools, and
237 not more than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be
238 allocated to the State Coalition of Young Men's Christian
239 Association (YMCA). The Attorney General's Office is further
240 authorized to escalate an amount not to exceed Four Million Five
241 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,500,000.00) for such purposes of this
242 section.

243 **SECTION 15.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
244 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
245 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
246 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
247 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
248 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
249 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
250 made without competitive bids.

251 **SECTION 16.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
252 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
253 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
254 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
255 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
256 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

257 **SECTION 17.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
258 and after July 1, 2006.
