1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR $2007.$
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007
10	\$ 16,082,202.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007
18	\$ 12,413,284.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
26	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
27	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall

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pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
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    Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
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    the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
    money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."

126 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 127 Committee for Fiscal Year 2008. SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 128 129 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 130 Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds 131 generated from the Forest Acreage Tax, and with funds generated from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites an amount 132 not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00). 133 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State 134 135 Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 136 Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of expenditure, with funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund the Forest Resource 137 138 Development Program in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these funds is 139 hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts and 140 expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in 141 142 accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq. and Section 27-104-1 et 143 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972. SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 144 145 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed 146 147 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of funds that become available to the commission. This escalation 148 149 shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the 150 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used 151 152 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day. 153 The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds 154 shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written 155 156 notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal

Officer.

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158 SECTION 8. The Forestry Commission has the authority to 159 purchase from the "General Services Administration" Fire Fighter 160 Catalog and any other GSA Catalog as long as the cost of such 161 items are less than the quotes received. 162 SECTION 9. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 163 fund designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment 164 Conversion Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry Commission to assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the 165 166 State Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal 167 Property Program or by Volunteer Fire Departments through other 168 means to adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires. This assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks 169 170 or other accessories necessary for the operation of fire suppression units, installation of piping and valves, painting or 171 172 other similar or associated component work necessary to place fire suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle 173 174 maintenance or repair. 175 The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and 176 177 services performed for Volunteer Fire Departments by the State 178 Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be 179 deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion 180 Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon 181 182 requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration. 183 184 The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not 185 exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of 186 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State 187 188 Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. 189 in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and 190 shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 192 fund designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be 193 used by the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management 194 activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County, 195 Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but 196 not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities 197 and regeneration work. The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by 198 monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source. 199 200 Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into 201 the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall 202 make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies 203 and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and 204 upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of 205 Finance and Administration. 206 It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving 207 funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary 208 operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall 209 210 remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future 211 years. 212 SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention of 213 214 the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) 215 shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce 216 for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal 217 Year 2007. SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that 218 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 219 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 220 221 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 222 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind

shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

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224	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
225	made without competitive bids.
226	SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
227	of Section 2, Eight Hundred Twenty-two Thousand Four Hundred

229	Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code
230	of 1972, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State
