1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2007.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007
10	\$ 9,149,261.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007
18	\$ 49,038,179.00.
19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22	the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23	July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007 \$ 5,750,000.00.
24	The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the
25	amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it
26	sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and
27	other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside

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from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
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    provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
    as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
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    any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
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    1972.
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         Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
    expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
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    authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to
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    the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage
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    funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.
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         SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
    Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the
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    amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred
    Thirty-five Dollars ($125,335.00) shall be derived from the
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    Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
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    and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of
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    defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2007.
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         SECTION 4.
                     It is the intention of the Legislature that the
    Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
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    authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
    Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty
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    Thousand Dollars ($350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation,
    protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and
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    wildlife of this state.
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         SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
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    Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:

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         Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation
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Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase

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equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation
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    Plan or Fifteen Hundred Dollars ($1,500.00), whichever is greater,
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    with not more than one-half (1/2) to be awarded on July 1, 2006,
    with the remainder to be awarded on January 1, 2007.
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         With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
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    the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
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    make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
    Services" for Fiscal Year 2008 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2007
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    funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
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    are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2008 budget by the
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    Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
    Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
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    determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
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    appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
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          It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
    that no single personnel action increases this projected annual

    cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2007 appropriation for "Personal
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    Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.
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    If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
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    Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
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    has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
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    projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2007 "Personal Services"
    appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
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    reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
    requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
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    such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
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         Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
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    the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
    allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
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    Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
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    approval from the Department of Finance and Administration.
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    Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
    approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
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94 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 95 appropriated level. No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 96 97 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 98 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 99 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 100 SECTION 6. Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be 101 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred 102 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum. 103 Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of 104 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one county to another on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on 105 106 out-of-county duty shall not be applicable. 107 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain 108 109 complete accounting and personnel records related to the 110 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 111 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2006. It is further the intention of 112 113 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2008 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 114 115 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2007 budget request 116 117 process. 118 SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 119 120 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 121 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 122 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 123 124 performance measures provided below: 125 FY2007

171	fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within
172	such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is
173	empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not
174	exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the
175	general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall
176	reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the
177	actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by
178	the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental
179	thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and
180	empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary
181	to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the
182	United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
183	necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
184	such purposes.
185	SECTION 12. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee
186	or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use
187	of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
188	Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for
189	any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of
190	Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

     regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.
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          SECTION 14.
                       In order to be in compliance with Sections
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     63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be
     expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay
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     the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees
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     and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the
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     course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold
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     a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.
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          SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
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     Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
     authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi
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     Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars
     ($4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi
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     Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of
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     constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.
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          SECTION 16. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
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     Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
     One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars ($150,000.00) and to enter into
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     an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
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     for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.
          The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to

- 238 **SECTION 21.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 239 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 240 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 241 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 242 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 243 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 244 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 245 made without competitive bids.
- 246 **SECTION 22.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- of Section 2, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) shall
- 248 be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund, as created in Section
- 249 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, to defray the expenses of
- 250 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.
- 251 **SECTION 23.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 252 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 253 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 254 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 255 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 256 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

257 **SECTION 24.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 258 and after July 1, 2006.
