1 2 3 4	AN ACT PROHIBITING THE DISRUPTIVE PROTEST AND DESECRATION OF A MILITARY FUNERAL, BURIAL SERVICE, OR MEMORIAL SERVICE; PROVIDING PENALTIES AND CIVIL REMEDY FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. (1) For purposes of this section, the following
7	terms shall have the following meanings:
8	(a) "Funeral ceremony" means a service or rite
9	commemorating the deceased with the body present.
10	(b) "Funeral service" means any services which may be
11	used to:
12	(i) Care for and prepare dead human bodies for
13	burial, cremation or other final disposition; and
14	(ii) Arrange, supervise, or conduct the funeral
15	ceremony or the final disposition of dead human bodies.
16	(c) "Graveside service" means a service or rite,
17	conducted at the place of interment, commemorating the deceased
18	with the body present.
19	(d) "Memorial service" means a ceremony or rite
20	commemorating the deceased without the body present.
21	(e) "Targeted residential picketing" includes the
22	following acts when committed on more than one (1) occasion:
23	(i) Marching, standing or patrolling by one or
24	more persons directed solely at a particular residential building
25	in a manner that adversely affects the safety, security or privacy
26	of an occupant of the building; or
27	(ii) Marching, standing or patrolling by one or

more persons which prevents an occupant of a residential building

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- 29 from gaining access to or exiting from the property on which the
- 30 residential building is located.
- 31 (2) (a) Whoever does any of the following shall be guilty
- 32 of a misdemeanor:
- (i) With intent to disrupt a funeral service,
- 34 graveside service, memorial service, or funeral ceremony, protests
- 35 or pickets within 1,000 feet of the location or locations at which
- 36 the service or ceremony is being conducted within one (1) hour
- 37 before, during, and one (1) hour following the service or
- 38 ceremony;
- 39 (ii) With intent to disrupt a funeral procession
- 40 impedes vehicles that are part of the funeral procession;
- 41 (iii) Intentionally blocks access to a funeral
- 42 service, funeral ceremony, graveside service or memorial service;
- 43 or
- 44 (iv) Engages in targeted residential picketing at
- 45 the home or domicile of any surviving member of the deceased
- 46 person's immediate family on the date of the service or ceremony,
- 47 and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not
- 48 more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in
- 49 the county jail for not more than six (6) months, or by both such
- 50 fine and imprisonment.
- 51 (b) Whoever is convicted of a second or subsequent
- 52 violation of paragraph (a) shall be guilty of a gross misdemeanor,
- 53 and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not
- 54 more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by imprisonment in
- 55 the county jail for not more than one (1) year, or by both such
- 56 fine and imprisonment. For purposes of this paragraph, a second
- 57 or subsequent violation includes a violation of a statute from
- 58 another state in conformity with this statute.
- 59 (3) In addition to the criminal penalties provided in
- 60 subsection (2) of this section, the court may enjoin conduct
- 61 prohibited in subsection (2) of this section, and may in such

- 62 proceeding award damages, including attorney fees or other
- 63 appropriate relief against a person, if there is credible evidence
- 64 that the person has violated, or is likely to violate, subsection
- 65 (2) of this section. Any surviving member of the deceased
- 66 person's immediate family who is damaged or threatened with loss
- 67 or injury by reason of a violation described in subsection (2) of
- 68 this section is entitled to sue for and have injunctive relief and
- 69 appropriate remedial compensation in any court of competent
- 70 jurisdiction against any damage or threatened loss or injury by
- 71 reason of a violation thereof.
- 72 **SECTION 2.** Section 1 of this act shall be codified within
- 73 Chapter 35, Title 97, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 74 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 75 and after July 1, 2006.
