8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI
9	<b>SECTION 1.</b> (1) For purposes of this section, the following
10	terms shall have the following meanings:

- 11 (a) "Funeral ceremony" means a service or rite
- 12 commemorating the deceased with the body present.
- 13 (b) "Funeral service" means any services which may be

- 15 (i) Care for and prepare dead human bodies for

- 17 (ii) Arrange, supervise, or conduct the funeral
- 18 ceremony or the final disposition of dead human bodies.

- 20 conducted at the place of interment, commemorating the deceased

- 22 (d) "Memorial service" means a ceremony or rite

Any surviving member of the deceased 68 person's immediate family who is damaged or threatened with loss 69 or injury by reason of a violation described in subsection (2) of 70 this section is entitled to sue for and have injunctive relief and 71 72 appropriate remedial compensation in any court of competent jurisdiction against any damage or threatened loss or injury by 73
- SECTION 2. Any person or group that wishes to display on signs, goods or clothing the name or image of any member of the United States Armed Forces who was killed while on active duty shall first obtain the written consent for that display from the family of the deceased.
