HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 40

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1 265, MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO PROVIDE THAT A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY SHALL NOT PROHIBIT OR DISCOURAGE ANY PERSON, 2 3 4 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE, FROM EXPRESSING A BELIEF IN OR ACKNOWLEDGING THE EXISTENCE OF A SUPREME BEING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF 7 MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the 8 9 state: Amend Section 265, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read 10 as follows: 11 "Section 265. (1) No person who denies the existence of a 12 Supreme Being shall hold any office in this state. 13 14 (2) A governmental entity shall not prohibit or discourage any person, public or private, from expressing a belief in or 15 acknowledging the existence of a Supreme Being except to the 16 extent that such expression or acknowledgment conflicts with or is 17 in violation of the constitutional guarantee of free exercise of 18 religion, the constitutional prohibition against establishment of 19 religion or any other specific constitutional rights, guarantees 20 or prohibitions specifically provided for under this Constitution 21 22 or the Constitution of the United States. 23 For the purpose of this subsection, the term "governmental 24 entity" means the State of Mississippi and any agency, department, institution, instrumentality or political subdivision thereof, and 25 any agency, department, institution or instrumentality of a 26

27 political subdivision of the State of Mississippi."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November 2006, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution and by general law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed 33 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: 34 "This proposed constitutional amendment provides that a governmental entity shall 35 not prohibit or discourage any person, public or private, from 36 expressing a belief in or acknowledging the existence of a Supreme 37 38 Being except to the extent that such expression or acknowledgment conflicts with or is in violation of some other rights, guarantees 39 40 or prohibitions specifically provided for under the Mississippi Constitution or the Constitution of the United States." 41
