HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 49

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1 241, MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO PROVIDE THAT SUFFRAGE 2 SHALL BE RESTORED TO PERSONS CONVICTED FOR THE FIRST TIME OF 3 4 CRIMES UPON COMPLETION OF SENTENCE.

5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi 6 Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the 7 8 state:

9 Amend Section 241, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read 10 as follows:

"Section 241. Every inhabitant of this state, except idiots 11 and insane persons, who is a citizen of the United States of 12 America, eighteen (18) years old and upward, who has been a 13 resident of this state for one (1) year, and for one (1) year in 14 the county in which he offers to vote, and for six (6) months in 15 16 the election precinct or in the incorporated city or town in which 17 he offers to vote, and who is duly registered as provided in this article, and who has never been convicted of murder, rape, 18 19 bribery, theft, arson, obtaining money or goods under false pretense, perjury, forgery, embezzlement or bigamy, is declared to 20 21 be a qualified elector, except that he shall be qualified to vote for President and Vice President of the United States if he meets 22 23 the requirements established by Congress therefor and is otherwise 24 a qualified elector. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any person who has been convicted for a first felony conviction of murder, 25 26 rape, bribery, theft, arson, obtaining money or goods under false pretense, perjury, forgery, embezzlement or bigamy who has 27 completed the sentence imposed for such crime." 28 *HR07/R1713* H. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be 29 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at 30 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday 31 32 of November 2006, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution 33 and by general law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed 34 35 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed 36 constitutional amendment will allow persons who have been convicted for a first felony conviction of murder, rape, bribery, 37 theft, arson, obtaining money or goods under false pretence, 38 39 perjury, forgery, embezzlement or bigamy to have their suffrage restored upon completion of sentence." 40
