HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 81

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE DIVISION OF MEDICAID 1 2 TO IMPLEMENT A PILOT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE CHRONIC DISEASE MANAGEMENT 3 OF CHRONIC OBSTRUCTIVE PULMONARY DISEASE USING NO STATE FUNDS; AND 4 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), also known as chronic bronchitis and emphysema, is the fourth leading 6 cause of death in the United States and the only one of the top 7 five causes whose prevalence and death rate are rising; and 8 9 WHEREAS, COPD is a chronic progressive disease that impacts 10 an estimated 30 million Americans and caused approximately 121,000 deaths in 2000; and 11 WHEREAS, the annual cost to the nation for COPD in 2000 was 12 estimated to be approximately \$30.4 billion; and 13 WHEREAS, early diagnosis and management of COPD can 14 effectively reduce the overall financial burden of the illness 15 16 within public programs such as Medicaid; and 17 WHEREAS, proper management of COPD can lead to improved quality of life and self-sufficiency on the part of patients cared 18 19 for within public programs: NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 20 21 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN, That we encourage the Division of Medicaid to pursue the 22 23 feasibility of implementing a pilot program to provide chronic 24 disease management of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease using only private sources of funding and no state funds, in an effort 25 26 to reduce the financial and clinical burden of COPD illness on the Medicaid program and the citizens of Mississippi. 27

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That if a pilot program is deemed 28 feasible, that the division implement such a program using only 29 private sources of funding and no state funds, and prepare a 30 31 report of findings and recommendations and provide the report to 32 the Office of the Governor and the Chairmen of the House Public Health and Human Services Committee, the Senate Public Health and 33 34 Welfare Committee and the House Medicaid Committee so that they can evaluate the effectiveness of the pilot program in reducing 35 costs within the Medicaid program and in providing improved health 36 and well-being of the affected patients. 37
