Drake and joined the Milford Missionary Baptist Church; and 14 WHEREAS, as a member of the church, he held a number of 15 positions such as, deacon, Sunday School teacher, choir member and 16 church treasurer; member of the M.B.P.F.B. Society; Milford 17 18 Brotherhood Club; Deacon Progressive Club; and Clover Hill Masonic 19 Lodge #13; and 20 WHEREAS, not only was he active in the church, he was active 21 in many organizations throughout the community, including 22 membership in the Natchez Business and Civic League, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and 23 Secretary of the Port Commission for 10 years; and 24 WHEREAS, he also made history with the Natchez-Adams County 25 26 Port Commission when, in 1976, he became the first African American appointee to the commission; and 27
