HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 106

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE
2 MCADAMS HIGH SCHOOL BULLDOGS BOYS BASKETBALL TEAM FOR THEIR
3 OUTSTANDING 2005-2006 SEASON AND FOR WINNING THE CLASS 1A STATE
4 CHAMPIONSHIP.

5 WHEREAS, the McAdams High School Bulldogs Boys Basketball
6 Team finished the 2005-2006 season with an outstanding record of
7 31 wins and 6 losses; and

8 WHEREAS, the Bulldogs did very well in the state playoffs
9 this year, winning the Class 1A State Championship by defeating
10 Ingomar 61-50 for McAdams' first state title since 1984; and

11 WHEREAS, Coach Chad Jackson succeeded his father, Wilson
12 Jackson, in 2003, as head coach at McAdams and has returned
13 McAdams to the status of state champions as his father did twice
14 in his 33 years at McAdams; and

15 WHEREAS, the Bulldogs have been superbly coached and inspired
16 by Head Coach Chad Jackson who has broadened the Bulldogs'
17 knowledge of the game and refined their skills in execution; and

18 WHEREAS, the Bulldogs have developed a winning and
19 cooperative spirit and a high degree of sportsmanship, and their
20 activities and attitude reflect great credit upon the individual
21 players and their coach and bring honor to McAdams High School;

23 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
24 and commend excellence, especially when evidenced by the youth of
25 our state, who are its future:

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
27 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
28 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend and congratulate the McAdams

29 High School Bulldogs Boys Basketball Team and their Head Coach
30 Chad Jackson for their outstanding 2005-2006 season, for winning
31 the Class 1A State Championship and for displaying tireless
32 devotion to their athletic endeavors.
