A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE BRAVERY AND SELFLESSNESS OF JOE 1 BIGGS, SR., DURING HURRICANE KATRINA. 2 3 WHEREAS, Joe Biggs, Sr., of Escatawpa, Mississippi, leaving 4 his wife and children in a vacant gas station on higher ground, set off wading in flood waters to save his neighborhood; and 5 WHEREAS, it was in those few hours on August 29, 2005, when 6 7 the residents did not know if the water would ever stop rising that Biggs became a hero along Wisteria Drive; and 8 9 WHEREAS, combing the neighborhood in his 14-foot aluminum skiff, Biggs rescued Emma Jean Madere and Stormy Madere, her 10 11 37-year-old mentally challenged daughter, who initially decided to wait out the storm; and 12 WHEREAS, described as always having been a good neighbor, 13 this husband and father of six, has always been willing to lend a 14 15 helping hand to anyone in need; and WHEREAS, wanting to ensure that everyone in his Mimosa 16 Park neighborhood was safe before he and his family left, Biggs, 17 convinced that someone needed to help his neighbors, decided it 18 should be him; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Biggs throughout his 15 years of helping his neighbors was nothing short of helpful, even in the looming 21 22 dangers posed by Katrina's fury and aftermath, as he saved seven 23 people with his skiff; and WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to 24 25 recognize such selfless acts of kindness as evidenced by a man of Mr. Biggs' caliber: 26
