L9	Crudup-Ward Activity Center opened in November 1996, offering
20	child care for 144 children per shift, after school and summer

22	Community Housing Development Organization services and more; and
23	WHEREAS, the eldest of 12 children born to A.B. and Catherine
24	Crudup of Pulaski, Mississippi, Mrs. Lowery earned a business
25	administration degree from Alcorn State University, and after
26	marrying Willie, moved to Moscow, Idaho, where she was hired as an
