## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 20

A RESOLUTION ACKNOWLEDGING THE VITAL ROLE OF THE AMERICAN

2	STROKE ASSOCIATION AND URGING THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE TO ENACT LEGISLATION TO ESTABLISH A SYSTEM OF STROKE CARE IN THE STATE.
4	WHEREAS, according to the American Stroke Association, a
5	division of the American Heart Association, strokes are the third
6	leading cause of death in the United States striking about 700,000
7	Americans each year; and
8	WHEREAS, stroke is a leading cause of serious long-term
9	disability in the United States with 4.8 million stroke survivors
10	today; and
11	WHEREAS, in 2004, the estimated direct and indirect cost of
12	stroke is about \$53.6 billion; and
13	WHEREAS, the Institute of Medicine (IOM) of the National
14	Academy of Science has concluded that the fragmentation of the
15	delivery of health care services frequently results in suboptimal
16	treatment, safety concerns and inefficient use of health care
17	resources; and
18	WHEREAS, the IOM recommended the establishment of coordinated
19	systems of care that integrate preventative and treatment services
20	and promote patient access to evidence-based care resources; and
21	WHEREAS, according to the American Stroke Association
22	research, a systems approach is necessary to effectuate true
23	change in the way stroke is treated statewide so that patients
24	have access to the most advanced treatment in centers that are
25	best designed and equipped to deal with the critical and time

sensitive needs of stroke patients; and
