- 4 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature wishes to acknowledge

- 23 brigade to the 1st Cavalry Division with division headquarters to
- 24 be located at Camp Victory, just outside of Baghdad International
- 25 Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq; and
- WHEREAS, the 238th ASOS embarked upon both missions to secure
- 27 and preserve peace and to protect the lives and interests of all
