SENATE BILL NO. 2046

1 AN ACT TO CODIFY SECTION 3-3-15.1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
2 TO DIRECT THE BUREAU OF CAPITOL FACILITIES TO DISPLAY THE POW/MIA
3 FLAG AT THE NEW CAPITOL BUILDING ON CERTAIN DAYS RELATING TO THE
4 RECOGNITION OF VETERANS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** The following provision shall be codified as

7 Section 3-3-15.1, Mississippi Code of 1972:

8 3-3-15.1. (1) In order to commemorate the 50th anniversary
9 of the Korean Conflict, the Legislature enacts this Section 3-3-
10 15.1 as the symbol of the nation's and the state's commitment to
11 achieving the fullest possible accounting for Mississippians who
12 have been or in the future may become prisoners of war, missing in
13 action or otherwise unaccounted for as a result of hostile action.

14 (2) As used in this Section 3-3-15.1, the term "POW/MIA
15 Flag" means the National League of Families POW/MIA flag
16 recognized officially and designated by Section 2 of Public Law
17 101-355 (36 USC 189).

18 (3) The Bureau of Capitol Facilities shall display the
19 POW/MIA flag in a prominent place at the New Capitol Building on
20 the following days:

- 21 (a) Armed Forces Day, the third Saturday in May;
22 (b) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;
23 (c) Flag Day, June 14;
24 (d) Independence Day, July 4;
25 (e) National POW/MIA Recognition Day; and
26 (f) Veterans Day, November 11.

27 (4) Such display shall serve as the symbol of the nation's
28 and the state's concern and commitment to achieving the fullest

29 possible accounting of Americans and Mississippians who, having
30 been prisoners of war or missing in action, still remain
31 unaccounted for.

32 (5) This section shall not be construed or applied so as to
33 either require or prohibit the display of the POW/MIA flag by any
34 county, municipality or public school district in Mississippi.

35 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
36 and after its passage.
