## SENATE BILL NO. 2270

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 REQUIRE SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL REPORT OF TEACHER 3 VACANCIES BY INSTRUCTIONAL AREA TO THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION FOR SUBMISSION TO THE LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED 4 5 PURPOSES BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: б 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-3-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 37-3-11. \* \* \* 9 \* \* \* From and after July 1, 1984, the State Superintendent 10 of Public Education shall perform the duties assigned to him by 11 the State Board of Education, and he shall have the following 12 13 duties: 14 (a) To serve as Secretary for the State Board of 15 Education; To be the Chief Administrative Officer of the State 16 (b) Department of Education; 17 (c) To recommend to the State Board of Education for 18 19 its consideration rules and regulations for the supervision of the 20 public free schools and agricultural high schools of the state and 21 for the efficient organization and conduct of the same; 22 (d) To collect data and make it available to the State 23 Board for determining the proper distribution of the state common 24 school funds; To keep a complete record of all official acts of 25 (e) the state superintendent and the acts of the State Board of 26 27 Education;

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(f) To prepare, have printed and furnish all officers charged with the administration of the laws pertaining to the public schools, such blank forms and books as may be necessary to the proper discharge of their duties, said printing to be paid for out of funds provided by the Legislature;

33 To have printed in pamphlet form the laws (a) pertaining to the public schools and publish therein forms for 34 conducting school business, the rules and regulations for the 35 government of schools that the State Superintendent or the Board 36 of Education may recommend, and such other matters as may be 37 38 deemed worthy of public interest pertaining to the public schools, said printing to be paid for out of funds provided by the 39 40 Legislature;

To meet all superintendents annually at such time 41 (h) and place as the State Superintendent shall appoint for the 42 purpose of accumulating facts relative to schools, to review the 43 44 educational progress made in the various sections of the state, to 45 compare views, discuss problems, hear discussions and suggestions relative to examinations and qualifications of teachers, methods 46 47 of instruction, textbooks, summer schools for teachers, visitation of schools, consolidation of schools, health work in the schools, 48 49 vocational education and other matters pertaining to the public 50 school system;

51 (i) To advise all superintendents upon all matters 52 involving the welfare of the schools, and at the request of any superintendent to give an opinion upon a written statement of 53 54 facts on all questions and controversies arising out of the interpretation and construction of the school laws, in regard to 55 rights, powers and duties of school officers and superintendents, 56 and to keep a record of all such decisions. Before giving any 57 58 opinion, the superintendent may submit the statement of facts to 59 the Attorney General, and it shall be the duty of the Attorney

(j) To require annually, and as often as the State
Superintendent may deem proper, of all superintendents, detailed
reports on the educational business of the various districts;
(k) On or before January 10 in each year to prepare
under the direction of the State Board of Education and have

67 printed the annual report of the board to the Legislature showing: 68 (i) The receipts and disbursements of all school

69 funds handled by the board;

70 <u>(ii)</u> The number of school districts, school 71 teachers employed, school administrators employed, pupils taught 72 and the attendance record of pupils therein;

73 (iii) County and district levies for each school
 74 district and agricultural high school;

75 <u>(iv)</u> The condition of vocational education, a list 76 of schools to which federal and state aid has been given, and a 77 detailed statement of the expenditures of federal funds and the 78 state funds that may be provided, and the ranking of subjects 79 taught as compared with the state's needs;

80 <u>(v)</u> Such general matters, information and 81 recommendations as relate, in the board's opinion, to the 82 educational interests of the state; and

83 (vi) A report of all school district teacher
84 vacancies, including the instructional area of such teacher
85 vacancies, for the previous school year. Failure to report such

86 vacancies may result in the withholding of state funds as provided 87 in Section 37-151-95;

88 (1) To determine the number of educable children in the
89 several school districts under rules and regulations prescribed by
90 the State Board of Education;

91 (m) To perform such other duties as may be prescribed92 by the State Board of Education.
