10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
11	SECTION 1. Section 25-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
12	amended as follows:
13	25-3-31. The annual salaries of the following elected state
14	and district officers are fixed as follows:
15	Governor\$122,160.00
16	Attorney General 108,960.00
17	Secretary of State
18	Commissioner of Insurance
19	State Treasurer
20	State Auditor of Public Accounts
21	Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce
22	Transportation Commissioners
23	Public Service Commissioners
24	If the person serving as Governor on December 31, 2003, is
25	reelected to the office of Governor for the term beginning in the
26	year 2004, he may choose not to receive the salary increase
27	authorized by this section, but to receive, instead, an annual
28	salary of One Hundred One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars
29	(\$101,800.00) during his new term of office by filing a written
30	request with the Department of Finance and Administration.

The above fixed salary of the Governor shall be the reference amount utilized in computing average compensation and earned compensation pursuant to Section 25-11-103(f) and Section 25-11-103(k) and to related sections which require such computations.

This section shall stand repealed from and after <u>July 1</u>, <u>2008</u>.

38 SECTION 2. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 39 amended as follows:

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25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges

41 are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next term of office immediately succeeding the existing term: 42 43 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court..... \$115,390.00 Presiding Justice of the Supreme Court..... 44 113,190.00 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each.... 45 112,530.00 However, in addition to their present official duties, there 46 47 are imposed upon the Supreme Court justices the extra duties of 48 making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions 49 50 as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, and of identifying and directing the 51 52 State Librarian to apply for grants and donations from any public or private source for the purpose of enhancing the holdings of the 53 54 state law library, and of advising and counseling with the State 55 Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use in the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon 56 57 the removal from the library of any books which may be the least frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient 58 59 location so as to provide additional space for such books and other current publications which may be more frequently used or 60 61 called for. As each existing term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in due course, the extra duties and compensation provided for shall cease.

The fixed salaries as specified in this subsection (1) shall be the exclusive and total compensation which can be reported to the Public Employees' Retirement System for retirement purposes; however, any judge in office on December 31, 2003, may continue to report his expense allowance as part of his compensation for retirement purposes.

81 Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals \$108,130.00 Associate Judges of the Court of Appeals, each... 82 105,050.00 83 However, in addition to their present official duties, there are imposed upon the judges of the Court of Appeals the extra 84 85 duties of making a special study of existing laws and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi such constructive 86 87 suggestions as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the 88 administration of justice, and assisting in advising and counseling with the State Librarian in the selection of law books 89 90 for purchase and use in the State Law Library, assisting in advising with the librarian thereof upon the removal from the 91 library of any books which may be the least frequently used, and 92 for the placing of same in a convenient location so as to provide 93 94 additional space for such books and other current publications 95 which may be more frequently used or called for. The fixed salaries as specified in this subsection (2) shall be the exclusive and total compensation which can be reported to the Public Employees' Retirement System for retirement purposes; however, any judge in office on December 31, 2003, may continue to report his expense allowance as part of his compensation for retirement purposes.

110 (3) The annual salaries of the chancery and circuit court 111 judges are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the 112 next term of office immediately succeeding the existing term: 113 Chancery Judges, each...... \$104,170.00 114 Circuit Judges, each..... 104,170.00

In addition to their present official duties, there are 115 116 imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to 117 118 trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi such constructive suggestions as they may deem 119 120 necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, 121 which shall be recommended to the Legislature by the Supreme Court in the manner provided by law. The judges shall advise and 122 123 supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and 124 facilities now existing in the libraries of each district to 125 126 effect the removal and relocation of obsolete publications so as 127 to provide additional space for those books and current 128 publications more frequently used. source for the purpose of enhancing the holdings of the libraries 130 131 of each district. The judges shall study the existing rules 132 promulgated by the circuit and chancery court judicial 133 associations governing the operation of chancery and circuit 134 courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws. For such 135 extra services each judge, from and after January 1, 2004, shall 136 receive a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries of the judges to aggregate One Hundred Four Thousand One Hundred Seventy 137 138 Dollars (\$104,170.00) per annum for each judge. Upon the expiration of the existing term, the above-captioned salaries 139 140 become effective in due course, and the extra duties and compensation provided for shall cease. 141

(4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
Department of Finance and Administration.

145 (5) The annual salary of the full-time district attorneys
146 shall be Ninety-five Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-six Dollars
147 (\$95,796.00).

The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants 148 (6) 149 shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor 150 more than eighty percent (80%) of the salary of the district 151 attorney for legal assistants who have been licensed to practice 152 law for five (5) years or less; eighty-five percent (85%) of the salary of the district attorney for legal assistants who have been 153 154 licensed to practice law for at least five (5) years but less than fifteen (15) years; and ninety percent (90%) of the salary of the 155 156 district attorney for legal assistants who have been licensed to 157 practice law for at least fifteen (15) years or more.

158 (7) This section shall stand repealed from and after <u>July 1</u>,

160 SECTION 3. Section 25-31-10, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 161 amended as follows:

164 (2) The district attorneys of the Third, Fifth, Ninth,
165 Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth, Seventeenth and
166 Twentieth Circuit Court Districts may appoint one (1) additional
167 full-time criminal investigator for a total of two (2) full-time
168 criminal investigators.

169 (3) The district attorneys of the First, Second, Fourth and
170 Seventh and Nineteenth Circuit Court Districts may appoint two (2)
171 additional full-time criminal investigators for a total of three
172 (3) full-time criminal investigators.

173 (4) No district attorney or assistant district attorney
174 shall accept any private employment, civil or criminal, in any
175 matter investigated by such criminal investigators.

176 The full and complete compensation for all public duties (5) rendered by said criminal investigators shall be not more than 177 Fifty-four Thousand Dollars (\$54,000.00) per annum, to be 178 179 determined at the discretion of the district attorney based upon the qualifications, education and experience of the criminal 180 181 investigator, plus necessary travel and other expenses, to be paid in accordance with Section 25-31-8. However, the maximum salary 182 183 under this subsection for a criminal investigator who has a law 184 degree may be supplemented by the district attorney from other 185 available funds, but not to exceed the maximum salary for a legal 186 assistant to a district attorney.

187 (6) Any criminal investigator may be designated by the 188 district attorney to attend the Law Enforcement Officers Training 189 Program set forth in Section 45-6-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 190 1972. The total expenses associated with attendance by criminal 191 investigators at the Law Enforcement Officers Training Program 192 shall be paid out of the funds of the appropriate district 193 attorney.
