COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2442

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE SHERIFF IN CERTAIN COUNTIES TO USE RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT UPON THE STREETS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS THAT ARE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND LOCATED 3 4 OUTSIDE THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF A MUNICIPALITY; AND FOR RELATED 5 6 PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 9 amended as follows: 10 [From and after July 1, 2006, and until July 1, 2008, this 11 section shall read as follows:] (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or peace 12 63-3-519. 13 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 14 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 15 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 16 17 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a 18 municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more upon the public streets of the municipality; 19 20 (b) By any college or university campus police force within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand 21 22 (2,000) students are enrolled; 23 (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any 24 municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand 25 (15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally designated highways lying within the corporate limits; 26 (d) By the sheriff of any of the counties listed in 27 paragraph (e) upon any public road, street or highway that is: 28

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(i) Under the jurisdiction of the county board of 29 supervisors for maintenance and construction; and 30 31 (ii) Located outside the corporate limits of a 32 municipality; and 33 (iii) Upon which road, street or highway the speed limit is clearly posted; or 34 35 (iv) In a posted school zone during school hours. This subsection shall apply to the following 36 (e) counties: Harrison, Jackson, Tunica, Lamar, Hinds, Lowndes, 37 Rankin, Lauderdale, Adams, Jones, DeSoto, Warren, Oktibbeha, Pike, 38 39 Pearl River, Clay, Noxubee and Washington Counties. The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall not set up 40 (2) 41 radar on highways within municipalities with a population in excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the latest 42 43 federal census. [From and after July 1, 2008, this section shall read as 44 45 follows:] 46 63-3-519. It shall be unlawful for any person or peace officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 47 48 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 49 50 highway of this state.
