- DISTRICT; TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-977, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON MAY BE A CANDIDATE FOR ONLY ONE JUDICIAL 3

- POST IN A SINGLE ELECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 9-7-42, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows:
- 9 9-7-42. (1) There shall be three (3) judges for the
- Fifteenth Circuit Court District. 10
- (2) For purposes of appointment and election, the three (3) 11
- judgeships shall be separate and distinct and denominated for 12
- purposes of appointment and election only as "Place One," "Place 13
- 14 Two" and "Place Three."
- (3) The initial holder of the "Place Three" judgeship shall 15
- be elected in the regular election of November 2006; candidates 16
- 17 therefor shall qualify to run not later than forty-five (45) days
- before that election. The person elected shall begin the term of 18
- 19 office in January of 2007 at the same time as circuit judges
- generally, and there shall be no vacancy of the office before that 20
- 21 time. The three (3) judges shall otherwise be elected, and any
- 22 vacancy in office filled, as provided for circuit judges
- 23 generally.

- SECTION 2. Section 23-15-977, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 2.4

- 23-15-977. (1) All candidates for judicial office as 26

- 29 5:00 p.m. on the first Friday after the first Monday in May prior
- 30 to the general election for judicial office and shall pay to the
- 31 proper officials the following amounts:
- 32 (a) Candidates for Supreme Court judge and Court of
- 33 Appeals, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).
- 34 (b) Candidates for circuit judge and chancellor, the
- 35 sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).
- 36 (c) Candidates for county judge and family court judge,
- 37 the sum of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00).
- 38 (2) Candidates for judicial offices listed in paragraphs (a)
- 39 and (b) of subsection (1) of this section shall file the intent to
- 40 be a candidate with, and pay the proper assessment made pursuant
- 41 to subsection (1) of this section to, the State Board of Election
- 42 Commissioners.
- 43 (3) Candidates for judicial offices listed in paragraph (c)
- 44 of subsection (1) of this section shall file the intent to be a
- 45 candidate with, and pay the proper assessment made pursuant to
- 46 subsection (1) of this section to, the circuit clerk of the proper
- 47 county. The circuit clerk shall notify the county commissioners
- 48 of election of all persons who have filed * * * intent to be a
- 49 candidate with, and paid the proper assessment to, the clerk. The
- 50 notification shall occur within two (2) business days and shall
- 51 contain all necessary information.
- 52 (4) A candidate may qualify for only one (1) judicial

- 54 SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 55 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 57 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 58 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 59 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 60 extended.
