SENATE BILL NO. 2513

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-9-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE SALARY PROVISIONS FOR THE COUNTY COURT JUDGESHIPS IN 3 MADISON COUNTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 9-9-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 9-9-11. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections 8 (2), (3) and (4), the county court judge shall receive an annual salary payable monthly out of the county treasury in an amount not 9 to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary 10 which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and 11 chancery judges of this state, in the discretion of the board of 12 13 supervisors of said county; provided, however, that the salary of such judge shall not be reduced during his term of office. 14 15 Provided further, that the office of county court judge in any 16 county receiving an annual salary of Thirty-six Thousand Dollars (\$36,000.00) or more shall be a full-time position, and the holder 17 18 thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law.

(2) In the event of the establishment of a county court by 19 20 agreement between two (2) or more counties as provided in Section 21 9-9-3, the county judge of the court so established shall be paid a salary equal to one and one-half (1-1/2) times that salary that 22 he would be paid if he were the judge of the smallest of such two 23 (2) or more counties, such salary to be paid in monthly 24 installments as provided by law; provided that such salary shall 25 26 not exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary of the circuit and chancery judges of this state. 27

30 (a) In any county having a population of seventy
31 thousand (70,000) or more according to the 1980 federal census,
32 the county judge shall receive an annual salary of One Thousand
33 Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit court judge.
34 The office of county judge shall be a full-time position, and the
35 holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law.

In any county having a population of sixty thousand 36 (b) (60,000) or more but less than seventy thousand (70,000) according 37 38 to the 1980 federal census, the county judge shall receive an annual salary of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00). The office 39 40 of county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. 41 The county judge shall not be eligible for any additional salary 42 except as may be authorized in subsection (4). 43

44 (C) In any county having a population of twenty-seven 45 thousand (27,000) or more but less than sixty thousand (60,000) according to the 1980 federal census, the county judge shall 46 47 receive an annual salary of not less than Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) but not more than Forty Thousand Dollars 48 49 (\$40,000.00), in the discretion of the board of supervisors of 50 said county. The county judge shall not be eligible for any 51 additional salary except as may be authorized in subsection (4). 52 In the event that the board of supervisors of said county elects to pay such county judge an annual salary of Thirty Thousand 53 54 Dollars (\$30,000.00) or more, the office of county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise 55 56 engage in the practice of law.

(d) In any county having a population of less than twenty-seven thousand (27,000) according to the 1980 federal census, the county judge shall receive an annual salary of not less than Four Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$4,200.00) and not S. B. No. 2513 *SSO3/R846* O6/SSO3/R846 PAGE 2 61 more than Eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500.00), in the 62 discretion of the board of supervisors of said county. The county 63 judge shall not be eligible for any additional salary except as 64 may be authorized in subsection (4).

(4) The county judge of any county described in this
subsection shall be paid the compensation, and he shall be subject
to any restrictions, set forth in the following paragraphs:

The county judge of any such Class 1 county with 68 (a) 69 population according to the latest federal decennial census of forty-five thousand (45,000) or more and lying wholly within a 70 71 levee district and having two (2) judicial districts shall, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of such county, receive an 72 73 annual salary not exceeding Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), 74 or a sum which is One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the 75 salary which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and 76 chancery judges of the state, whichever is greater.

77 (b) The county judge of any Class 1 county having an 78 area in excess of nine hundred twenty-five (925) square miles shall receive an annual salary of not less than Thirty Thousand 79 80 Dollars (\$30,000.00) but, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of such county, such salary may be not more than Five 81 82 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) less than the annual salary of a circuit judge, payable monthly out of the county treasury, and the county 83 84 judge shall not practice law.

85 The office of county judge in any such Class 1 (C) county with a population according to the 1970 federal decennial 86 87 census of greater than thirty-nine thousand (39,000), and where U.S. Highway 61 and Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, shall receive 88 an annual salary to be paid in monthly installments of not less 89 90 than an amount equal to ninety percent (90%) of the annual salary 91 which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and 92 chancery judges of the state, as follows: The salary of the 93 county judge shall be increased by ten percent (10%) annually *SS03/R846* S. 94 above the base salary of the preceding year until such time as the 95 judge's salary is equal to the amount that is provided by this 96 subsection. The office of county judge shall be a full-time 97 position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the 98 practice of law.

(d) In any Class 1 county bordering on the Mississippi 99 100 River and which has situated therein a national military park and 101 national military cemetery, the office of county judge shall be a 102 full-time position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. The salary for the county judge in 103 104 said county shall be fixed at a sum which is One Thousand Dollars 105 (\$1,000.00) less than the salary which is now or shall hereafter 106 be provided for circuit and chancery judges of this state.

107 (e) The county judge in any county having a population of at least forty-two thousand one hundred eleven (42,111), 108 109 according to the 1970 census, and where U.S. Highway 49E and U.S. Highway 82 intersect, shall receive an annual salary to be paid in 110 111 monthly installments of not less than Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) but not more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 112 113 (\$2,500.00) less than the annual salary of the circuit judge, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of said county. 114

115 (f) The county judge in any Class 1 county bordering on the Mississippi River and having an area of less than four hundred 116 fifty (450) square miles wherein U.S. Highways 84 and 61 intersect 117 118 shall receive an annual salary of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) less than the annual salary of a circuit judge, and 119 120 such county judge shall not practice law in any manner. The county judge in such county shall not be eligible to receive any 121 additional salary authorized by this section or from any other 122 123 source other than that set out and authorized by this paragraph. 124 (g) The county judge of any Class 1 county bordering on 125 the Mississippi River on the west and the State of Tennessee on

127 shall receive an annual salary of ninety percent (90%) of the 128 salary which is now or shall hereafter be provided for chancery 129 and circuit judges of this state, but in any event not less than 130 Sixty Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$60,200.00).

131 (h) The county judge of any Class 1 county with a 132 population of greater than sixty-nine thousand (69,000) according to the 1980 federal decennial census, and wherein U.S. Highway 80 133 and Mississippi Highway 43 intersect, shall receive an annual 134 135 salary in an amount not greater than the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) less than the salary which is now or shall 136 137 hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery judges of this state, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of said 138 139 county.

140 (i) The county judge of any county having a population in excess of sixty-six thousand (66,000) according to the 1980 141 142 federal decennial census, wherein is located a state-supported university and in which U.S. Highways 49 and 11 intersect, shall 143 144 receive an annual salary of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit court judge. The office of such 145 146 county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. 147

148 (j) The county judge of any county having two (2) 149 judicial districts, having a population in excess of sixty-one thousand nine hundred (61,900) according to the 1980 federal 150 151 decennial census, in which U.S. Interstate Highway 59 intersects with U.S. Highway 84, shall receive an annual salary of One 152 153 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary which is now or hereafter authorized to be paid circuit and chancery court judges 154 of this state. The office of such county judge shall be a 155 156 full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise 157 engage in the practice of law.

158 (k) The office of county judge of any Class I county 159 wherein U.S. Highway 51 and U.S. Highway 98 intersect shall be a S. B. No. 2513 *SSO3/R846* 06/SS03/R846 PAGE 5 160 full-time position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise 161 engage in the practice of law. The annual salary for the office 162 of county judge in said county may be fixed, in the discretion of 163 the board of supervisors of said county, at a sum not to exceed 164 Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) less than the salary which is now 165 or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery judges of 166 this state.

167 The county judge of any county having a population (1) 168 of more than forty-one thousand six hundred (41,600) but less than forty-one thousand six hundred fifty (41,650) according to the 169 170 1980 federal census, and wherein U.S. Highway 49 intersects with Mississippi Highway 22, shall receive an annual salary payable 171 172 monthly out of the county treasury of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary provided now or hereafter for 173 174 circuit and chancery judges of this state.

175 The county judge of any county having a population (m) of more than fifty-seven thousand (57,000) but less than 176 177 fifty-seven thousand one hundred (57,100) according to the 1980 federal census, wherein U.S. Highway 45 intersects with 178 179 Mississippi Highway 6, shall receive an annual salary in an amount 180 established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to exceed 181 the salary provided now or hereafter for circuit and chancery 182 judges of this state.

The county judge of any county having a population 183 (n) 184 of more than fifty-seven thousand three hundred (57,300) according 185 to the 1980 federal decennial census, wherein is located a 186 state-supported university and wherein U.S. Highways 82 and 45 187 intersect, shall receive an annual salary in an amount established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to exceed the salary 188 189 provided now or hereafter for circuit and chancery judges of this 190 state.

191 (5) The salary of a county court judge or justice court 192 judge shall not be reduced during his term of office as a result S. B. No. 2513 *SSO3/R846* 06/SS03/R846 PAGE 6 193 of a population decrease based upon the 1990 federal decennial 194 census.

195 (6) The salary of a sheriff shall not be reduced during his 196 term of office as a result of a population decrease based upon the 197 1990 federal decennial census.

198 (7) Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the 199 contrary, the board of supervisors of any county, in its 200 discretion, may pay its county court judge an annual salary of One 201 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit 202 court judge. The office of county judge shall be a full-time 203 position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the 204 practice of law.

SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, or October 1, 2006, whichever occurs later.
