## SENATE BILL NO. 2542

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-1-2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES SHALL BE THE SOLE 2 3 ADMINISTRATOR OF ALL FEDERAL FUNDS THAT ARE AVAILABLE TO 4 MISSISSIPPI FOR PROGRAMS THAT SERVICE THE MENTORING NEEDS OF "AT-RISK" YOUTH AND TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT TO EXPEND SUCH 5 б FUNDS WITHOUT CONTRACTING THE PROGRAMS TO ANOTHER STATE AGENCY; 7 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

9 SECTION 1. Section 43-1-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

10 amended as follows:

11 43-1-2. (1) There is created the Mississippi Department of 12 Human Services, whose offices shall be located in Jackson, 13 Mississippi, and which shall be under the policy direction of the 14 Governor.

15 (2) The chief administrative officer of the department shall 16 be the Executive Director of Human Services. The Governor shall 17 appoint the Executive Director of Human Services with the advice 18 and consent of the Senate, and he shall serve at the will and 19 pleasure of the Governor, and until his successor is appointed and 20 qualified. The Executive Director of Human Services shall possess 21 the following qualifications:

(a) A bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
of higher learning and ten (10) years' experience in management,
public administration, finance or accounting; or

(b) A master's or doctoral degree from an accredited
institution of higher learning and five (5) years' experience in
management, public administration, finance or accounting.

28 Those qualifications shall be certified by the State29 Personnel Board.

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30 (3) There shall be a Joint Oversight Committee of the 31 Department of Human Services composed of the respective chairmen 32 of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the Senate 33 Appropriations Committee, the House Public Health and Human 34 Services Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, three 35 (3) members of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor to 36 serve at the will and pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor, and three (3) members of the House of Representatives appointed by the 37 Speaker of the House to serve at the will and pleasure of the 38 Speaker. The chairmanship of the committee shall alternate for 39 40 twelve-month periods between the Senate members and the House members, on May 1 of each year, with the Chairman of the Senate 41 42 Public Health and Welfare Committee serving as chairman beginning 43 in even-numbered years, and the Chairman of the House Public Health and Human Services Committee serving as chairman beginning 44 in odd-numbered years. The committee shall meet once each 45 46 quarter, or upon the call of the chairman at such times as he 47 deems necessary or advisable, and may make recommendations to the 48 Legislature pertaining to any matter within the jurisdiction of 49 the Mississippi Department of Human Services. The appointing 50 authorities may designate an alternate member from their 51 respective houses to serve when the regular designee is unable to attend such meetings of the oversight committee. For attending 52 meetings of the oversight committee, such legislators shall 53 54 receive per diem and expenses which shall be paid from the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same 55 56 amounts as provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is 57 not in session; however, no per diem and expenses for attending meetings of the committee will be paid while the Legislature is in 58 59 No per diem and expenses will be paid except for session. 60 attending meetings of the oversight committee without prior 61 approval of the proper committee in their respective houses.

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The Department of Human Services shall provide the 62 (4) 63 services authorized by law to every individual determined to be 64 eligible therefor, and in carrying out the purposes of the 65 department, the executive director is authorized:

66 (a) To formulate the policy of the department regarding 67 human services within the jurisdiction of the department;

68 (b) To adopt, modify, repeal and promulgate, after due notice and hearing, and where not otherwise prohibited by federal 69 70 or state law, to make exceptions to and grant exemptions and variances from, and to enforce rules and regulations implementing 71 72 or effectuating the powers and duties of the department under any and all statutes within the department's jurisdiction, all of 73 74 which shall be binding upon the county departments of human 75 services;

76 (C) To apply for, receive and expend any federal or 77 state funds or contributions, gifts, devises, bequests or funds 78 from any other source;

79 Except as limited by Section 43-1-3, to enter into (d) 80 and execute contracts, grants and cooperative agreements with any 81 federal or state agency or subdivision thereof, or any public or private institution located inside or outside the State of 82 83 Mississippi, or any person, corporation or association in connection with carrying out the programs of the department; and 84

85 (e) To discharge such other duties, responsibilities 86 and powers as are necessary to implement the programs of the department. 87

The executive director shall establish the 88 (5) organizational structure of the Mississippi Department of Human 89 Services which shall include the creation of any units necessary 90 to implement the duties assigned to the department and consistent 91 with specific requirements of law, including, but not limited to: 92 93 (a)

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Office of Family and Children's Services;

Office of Youth Services; (b)

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(c) Office of Economic Assistance;

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(d) Office of Child Support Enforcement.

(6) The Executive Director of Human Services shall appoint 97 98 heads of offices, bureaus and divisions, as defined in Section 99 7-17-11, who shall serve at the pleasure of the executive 100 director. The salary and compensation of such office, bureau and 101 division heads shall be subject to the rules and regulations 102 adopted and promulgated by the State Personnel Board as created under Section 25-9-101 et seq. The executive director shall have 103 the authority to organize offices as deemed appropriate to carry 104 105 out the responsibilities of the department. The organization 106 charts of the department shall be presented annually with the 107 budget request of the Governor for review by the Legislature.

108 The Mississippi Department of Human Services shall be (7) the sole administrator of TANF and any other federal or other 109 110 special source funds that become available to the State of Mississippi to serve the mentoring needs of "at-risk" youth in the 111 112 state, including, but not limited to, Boys and Girls Clubs of Mississippi, Big Brothers Big Sisters of America, Communities in 113 114 Schools, Families First Resource Centers and the State Coalition of Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), and to accept, budget 115 116 and expend such funds in a manner consistent with the rules and regulations of the federal government and the Department of 117 Finance and Administration. The department shall not be required 118 119 to contract the administration of such at-risk youth services to another state agency. Allocation and escalation authority for 120 121 such special source funds for at-risk service programs shall be specified in the Department of Human Services' annual 122 123 appropriation bill. 124 This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2009. (8) SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 125

126 and after July 1, 2006.

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
