1 2 3 4 5	AN ACT TO DIRECT THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER TO TRANSFER CERTAIN SPECIAL FUNDS INTO THE BUDGET CONTINGENCY FUND DURING FISCAL YEAR 2006 TO AMEND SECTION 1, SECTION 3 AND SECTION 5, CHAPTER 119, LAWS OF SECOND EXTRAORDINARY SESSION 2005, TO INCREASE AND REDUCE FUNDS IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2006 APPROPRIATION TO THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE, DIVISION OF MEDICAID; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. The State Fiscal Officer shall transfer to the
9	Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, out of the
10	following enumerated special funds, the amount listed below for
11	each fund during the period beginning upon the passage of this act
12	through June 30, 2006:

18	SECTION 2. Section 1, Chapter 119, Laws of Second
19	Extraordinary Session 2005, is amended as follows:
20	Section 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
21	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
22	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's Office
23	- Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical
24	assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the
25	expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section
26	43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year
27	beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
28	\$ <u>355,819,843.00</u> .

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29	SECTION 3. Section 3, Chapter 119, Laws of Second
30	Extraordinary Session 2005, is amended as follows:
31	Section 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
32	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
33	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's Office
34	- Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source funds
35	collected by or otherwise available to the commission, for the
36	purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi
37	Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of
38	such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending
39	June 30, 2006\$ 3,009,281,635.00.
40	Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended
41	by the division when the recovery is received or finalized.
42	SECTION 4. Section 5, Chapter 119, Laws of Second
43	Extraordinary Session 2005, is amended as follows:

68	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
69	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
70	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
71	Services for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006
72	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
73	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the
74	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
75	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
76	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
77	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
78	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
79	that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
80	cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal
81	Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.
82	If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
83	Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
84	has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
85	projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services"
86	appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
87	reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
88	requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
89	such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
90	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
91	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
92	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
93	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
94	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
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- 95 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 96 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 97 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 98 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 100 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 101 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 102 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise
- 104 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,
- 105 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other
- 106 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless
- 107 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of
- 108 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the
- 109 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an
- 110 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public
- 111 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as
- 112 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement
- 113 of a departing employee with an individual from within state
- 114 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the
- 115 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,
- 116 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be
- 117 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise
- 118 authorized in this act.
- 119 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 120 and after its passage.
