## SENATE BILL NO. 2719

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-107-1, 37-107-3 AND 37-107-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS FOR CHILDREN OF MEMBERS OF THE ARMED SERVICES WHO WERE FATALLY INJURED OR TOTALLY DISABLED AS A RESULT OF INJURIES OR WOUNDS WHICH OCCURRED DURING ACTIVE MILITARY DUTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 3 4 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-107-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 9 37-107-1. (1) If any Mississippi law enforcement officer, full-time fire fighter or volunteer fire fighter shall suffer or 10 has suffered fatal injuries or wounds or become permanently and 11 totally disabled as a result of injuries or wounds which occurred 12 in the performance of the official and appointed duties of his or 13 14 her office, his or her spouse, child or children shall be entitled to an eight-semester scholarship without cost, exclusive of books, 15 16 food, school supplies, materials and dues or fees for 17 extracurricular activities, at any state-supported college or university of his or her choice within this state. 18 (2) If any member of the armed services, whose official 19 house of record and residence is within the State of Mississippi, 20 21 shall suffer or has suffered fatal injuries or wounds or become 22 permanently and totally disabled as a result of injuries or wounds which occurred during active military duty, his or her child or

- children shall be entitled to an eight-semester scholarship 24
- without cost, exclusive of books, food, school supplies, materials 25
- and dues or fees for extracurricular activities, at any 26
- 27 state-supported college or university of his or her choice within
- 28 this state.

- 29 (3) No child shall be entitled to receive scholarship
- 30 benefits during any semester or quarter when said child has
- 31 reached the age of twenty-three (23) years on the first day of
- 32 said semester or quarter. However, any child who has begun the
- 33 process of acquiring college credits under the provisions of this
- 34 section prior to attaining the age of twenty-three (23) years
- 35 shall be entitled to the full eight-semester scholarship if his or
- 36 her college instruction was interrupted for any reason.
- 37 (4) Scholarship benefits shall not accrue hereunder to any
- 38 person if the wounds or injuries suffered by any law enforcement
- 39 officer, full-time fire fighter, volunteer fire fighter or member
- 40 <u>of the armed services</u> are self-inflicted or if his death is
- 41 self-induced.
- 42 **SECTION 2.** Section 37-107-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 43 amended as follows:
- 44 37-107-3. (1) For the purposes of this chapter, Mississippi
- 45 law enforcement officers shall be defined as follows:
- 46 (a) "State highway patrolmen" means all law enforcement
- 47 officers, regardless of department or bureau, of the Mississippi
- 48 Highway Safety Patrol.
- (b) "Municipal police officers" means all law
- 50 enforcement officers of any municipality who are regular duty
- 51 personnel on full-time status, auxiliary or reserve officers, or
- 52 those serving on a temporary or part-time status.
- (c) "Sheriffs" and "deputy sheriffs" means all law
- 54 enforcement officers of full-time duty status on a regular basis
- 55 serving the sheriff's department of any county, deputy sheriffs
- 56 who are engaged in administrative or civil duty, auxiliary or
- 57 reserve deputies, or deputy sheriffs serving in a temporary
- 58 capacity or part-time basis.
- (d) "Constables" means all duly elected constables of
- 60 any beat of any county within the state while actually engaged in

- 61 the performance of their duties concerning the criminal laws of
- 62 the county and state.
- (e) "Conservation officers" means all duly appointed
- 64 game wardens employed by the State of Mississippi on a full-time
- 65 duty status while actually engaged in the performance of their
- 66 duties concerning the game laws of the state.
- (f) "Alcoholic Beverage Control Division agents and
- 68 inspectors" means all duly appointed agents and investigators of
- 69 the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division of the Mississippi State
- 70 Tax Commission on a full-time duty status while actually engaged
- 71 in the performance of their duties concerning the alcoholic
- 72 beverage control laws of the state.
- 73 (g) Members of the National Guard serving as peace
- 74 officers when ordered to state emergency duty under authority
- 75 vested in the Governor by the Constitution and laws of the state.
- 76 (h) "Tax commission scales enforcement officers" means
- 77 all duly appointed scales enforcement officers of the Mississippi
- 78 State Tax Commission on a full-time duty status while actually
- 79 engaged in the performance of their duties.
- 80 (i) Duly appointed agents of the Mississippi Bureau of
- 81 Narcotics.
- 82 (j) Correctional, probation and parole officers
- 83 employed by the Mississippi Department of Corrections.
- 84 (2) For the purposes of this chapter, Mississippi full-time
- 85 fire fighters shall be defined as all fire fighters employed by
- 86 any subdivision of the State of Mississippi on a full-time duty
- 87 status while actually engaged in the performance of their duties,
- 88 and volunteer fire fighters shall be defined as any volunteer fire
- 89 fighter registered with the State of Mississippi or a political
- 90 subdivision thereof on a volunteer fire fighting status while
- 91 actually engaged in the performance of fire fighting duties.
- 92 (3) For the purposes of this chapter, "child" or "children"
- 93 means natural children, adopted children or stepchildren.

- 94 (4) For purposes of this chapter, "spouse" means a person
- 95 who was, at the time of the death of the decedent, legally married
- 96 to a Mississippi law enforcement officer, full-time fire fighter,
- 97 or volunteer fire fighter, or in the case of a law enforcement
- 98 officer, full-time fire fighter or volunteer fire fighter who
- 99 suffered fatal injuries or wounds, prior to or after March 13,
- 100 1990, who has not remarried.
- 101 (5) For purposes of this chapter, "member of the armed
- 102 services" means a person serving in the United States Armed Forces
- 103 or on active duty in the National Guard or United States Armed
- 104 Forces Reserve.
- 105 **SECTION 3.** Section 37-107-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 106 amended as follows:
- 107 37-107-5. Any law enforcement officer, full-time fire
- 108 fighter, volunteer fire fighter or member of the armed services
- 109 claiming permanent and total disability under this chapter shall
- 110 be qualified, or disqualified, for such claim upon examination and
- 111 decision by any two (2) of the three (3) following staff members
- 112 of the University of Mississippi Medical Center: (a) Chairman of
- 113 the Board of Medicine, (b) Chief of the Division of Orthopedics,
- 114 and (c) Professor and Chairman of Surgery.
- The expenses of such examination shall be the responsibility
- 116 of the individual claimant unless otherwise provided for by a
- 117 municipality, county or the state.
- 118 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 119 and after July 1, 2006.
