## SENATE BILL NO. 2839

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REVISE THE LENGTH OF TIME A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 17 MUST 2 3 PRACTICE SUPERVISED DRIVING UNDER A TEMPORARY PERMIT IN ORDER TO 4 BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE; TO REVISE THE LENGTH OF TIME AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE MUST BE HELD; AND FOR RELATED 5 6 PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9 10 63-1-9. (1) No driver's license, intermediate license or temporary learning permit shall be issued pursuant to this 11 article: 12 To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years 13 (a) except as provided in this article. 14 To any person whose license to operate a motor (b) 15 vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked 16 17 or suspended by this state or any other state \* \* \* or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia, and such 18 revocation or suspension period has not expired. 19 20 (c) To any person who is an habitual drunkard or who is addicted to the use of other narcotic drugs. 21 22 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of physical or mental disability, in the opinion of the commissioner 23 24 or other person authorized to grant an operator's license, to operate a motor vehicle on the highways with safety. However, 25 persons who have one (1) arm or leg, or have arms or legs 26 27 deformed, and have their car provided with mechanical devices whereby they are able to drive in a safe manner over the highways, 2.8 if otherwise qualified, shall receive an operator's license the 29 \*SS06/R961\* S. 30 same as other persons. Moreover, deafness shall not be a bar to 31 obtaining a license.

32 (e) To any person who is under the age of seventeen 33 (17) years to drive any motor vehicle while in use as a school bus 34 for the transportation of pupils to or from school, or to drive 35 any motor vehicle while in use as a public or common carrier of 36 persons or property.

37 (f) To any person as an operator who has previously 38 been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental 39 disability and who has not at time of application been restored to 40 mental competency.

(g) To any unmarried person under the age of eighteen (18) years who does not at the time of application present a diploma or other certificate of high school graduation or a general education development certificate issued to the person in this state or any other state, or documentation that the person: (i) Is enrolled and making satisfactory progress

49 (ii) Is enrolled in school in this state or any 50 other state;

51 (iii) Is enrolled in a "nonpublic school," as such 52 term is defined in Section 37-13-91(2)(i); or

53 (iv) Is unable to attend any school program due to
54 circumstances deemed acceptable as set out in Section 63-1-10.

55 (h) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years 56 who has been convicted under Section 63-11-30.

57 (2) All permits and licenses issued on or before June 30,
58 <u>2006</u>, shall be valid according to the terms upon which issued.
59 From and after July 1, <u>2006</u>:

60 (a) A temporary driving permit may be issued to any
61 person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise
62 meets the requirements of this article.

No. 2839 \*SSO6/R961\* 06/SS06/R961 PAGE 2 63 (b) An intermediate license may be issued to any person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise meets the 64 requirements of this article and who has held a temporary driving 65 66 permit for at least one (1) year without any conviction under 67 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under 68 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the one-year requirement for the holding of a temporary driving permit 69 70 before an applicant can qualify for an intermediate license.

71 A driver's license may be issued to any person who (C) 72 is at least sixteen (16) years of age who otherwise meets the 73 requirements of this article and who has held an intermediate 74 license for at least one (1) year without any conviction under 75 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under 76 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the 77 one-year requirement for the holding of an intermediate license 78 before an applicant can qualify for a driver's license. However, a person who is at least seventeen (17) years of age who has been 79 80 issued a temporary driving permit and who has never been convicted under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall not be 81 82 required to have held an intermediate license.

(d) An applicant for a Mississippi driver's license who, at the time of application, is at least sixteen (16) years of age and who has held a valid motor vehicle driver's license issued by another state for at least six (6) months shall not be required to hold a temporary driving permit or an intermediate license before being issued a driver's license.

89 (3) The commissioner shall ensure that the temporary driving 90 permit, intermediate license and driver's license issued under 91 this article are clear, distinct and easily distinguishable from 92 one another.

93 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 94 and after July 1, 2006.
