## SENATE BILL NO. 2839 (As Passed the Senate)

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE LENGTH OF TIME A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 17 MUST PRACTICE SUPERVISED DRIVING UNDER A TEMPORARY PERMIT IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE; TO REVISE THE LENGTH OF TIME AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE MUST BE HELD; AND FOR RELATED
- 6 PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 63-1-9. (1) No driver's license, intermediate license or
- 11 temporary learning permit shall be issued pursuant to this
- 12 article:
- 13 (a) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 14 except as provided in this article.
- 15 (b) To any person whose license to operate a motor
- 16 vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked
- 17 or suspended by this state or any other state \* \* \* or territory
- 18 of the United States or the District of Columbia, and such
- 19 revocation or suspension period has not expired.
- 20 (c) To any person who is an habitual drunkard or who is
- 21 addicted to the use of other narcotic drugs.
- 22 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of
- 23 physical or mental disability, in the opinion of the commissioner
- 24 or other person authorized to grant an operator's license, to
- 25 operate a motor vehicle on the highways with safety. However,
- 26 persons who have one (1) arm or leg, or have arms or legs
- 27 deformed, and have their car provided with mechanical devices
- 28 whereby they are able to drive in a safe manner over the highways,
- 29 if otherwise qualified, shall receive an operator's license the S. B. No. 2839 \*SS26/R961PS\*

- 30 same as other persons. Moreover, deafness shall not be a bar to
- 31 obtaining a license.
- 32 (e) To any person who is under the age of seventeen
- 33 (17) years to drive any motor vehicle while in use as a school bus
- 34 for the transportation of pupils to or from school, or to drive
- 35 any motor vehicle while in use as a public or common carrier of
- 36 persons or property.
- 37 (f) To any person as an operator who has previously
- 38 been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental
- 39 disability and who has not at time of application been restored to
- 40 mental competency.
- 41 (g) To any unmarried person under the age of eighteen
- 42 (18) years who does not at the time of application present a
- 43 diploma or other certificate of high school graduation or a
- 44 general education development certificate issued to the person in
- 45 this state or any other state, or documentation that the person:
- 46 (i) Is enrolled and making satisfactory progress
- 47 in a course leading to a general education development
- 48 certificate;
- 49 (ii) Is enrolled in school in this state or any
- 50 other state;
- 51 (iii) Is enrolled in a "nonpublic school," as such
- 52 term is defined in Section 37-13-91(2)(i); or
- (iv) Is unable to attend any school program due to
- 54 circumstances deemed acceptable as set out in Section 63-1-10.
- (h) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 56 who has been convicted under Section 63-11-30.
- 57 (2) All permits and licenses issued on or before June 30,
- 58 2006, shall be valid according to the terms upon which issued.
- 59 From and after July 1, 2006:
- 60 (a) A temporary driving permit may be issued to any
- 61 person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise
- 62 meets the requirements of this article.

- (b) An intermediate license may be issued to any person
- 64 who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise meets the
- 65 requirements of this article and who has held a temporary driving
- 66 permit for at least one (1) year without any conviction under
- 67 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under
- 68 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the
- 69 one-year requirement for the holding of a temporary driving permit
- 70 before an applicant can qualify for an intermediate license.
- 71 (c) A driver's license may be issued to any person who
- 72 is at least sixteen (16) years of age who otherwise meets the
- 73 requirements of this article and who has held an intermediate
- 74 license for at least <u>six (6) months</u> without any conviction under
- 75 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under
- 76 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the
- 77 <u>six-month</u> requirement for the holding of an intermediate license
- 78 before an applicant can qualify for a driver's license. However,
- 79 a person who is at least seventeen (17) years of age who has been
- 80 issued a temporary driving permit and who has never been convicted
- 81 under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall not be
- 82 required to have held an intermediate license.
- 83 (d) An applicant for a Mississippi driver's license
- 84 who, at the time of application, is at least sixteen (16) years of
- 85 age and who has held a valid motor vehicle driver's license issued
- 86 by another state for at least six (6) months shall not be required
- 87 to hold a temporary driving permit or an intermediate license
- 88 before being issued a driver's license.
- 89 (3) The commissioner shall ensure that the temporary driving
- 90 permit, intermediate license and driver's license issued under
- 91 this article are clear, distinct and easily distinguishable from
- 92 one another.
- 93 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 94 and after July 1, 2006.
