SENATE BILL NO. 2901

AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI SATELLITE CRIME LAB STUDY 1 COMMITTEE; TO SPECIFY THE MEMBERSHIP THEREOF; TO SET FORTH THE 2 PURPOSE OF THE STUDY COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ELECTION OF A CHAIRPERSON AND OTHER OFFICERS; TO PROVIDE FOR MEETINGS OF THE 3 4 COMMITTEE; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO PROVIDE 5 б ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT TO THE COMMITTEE; TO SET FORTH ADDITIONAL 7 DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE; TO REQUIRE STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TO ASSIST THE COMMITTEE; TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMITTEE TO ENLIST THE SERVICE OF OTHER AGENCIES, ASSOCIATIONS 8 9 AND ORGANIZATIONS TO ASSIST THE COMMITTEE; TO AUTHORIZE THE 10 COMMITTEE TO EMPLOY SUPPORT PERSONNEL; TO AUTHORIZE PER DIEM 11 12 PAYMENT AND TRAVEL EXPENSES; TO AUTHORIZE EXPENDITURE OF 13 APPROPRIATED FUNDS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 15 SECTION 1. (1) The Mississippi Satellite Crime Lab Study Committee is hereby created. It shall consist of fifteen (15) 16 17 voting and two (2) nonvoting members who are to be selected as 18 follows: (a) The chair of the Department of the Administration 19 20 of Justice at the University of Southern Mississippi, or his 21 designee, shall be a member. (b) The chair of the Department of the Administration 22 23 of Justice at the University of Mississippi, or his designee, shall be a member. 24 25 (c) One (1) circuit judge shall be elected by the 26 Conference of Circuit Judges and one (1) county court judge shall 27 be elected by the Conference of County Court Judges. (d) One (1) sheriff shall be elected by the Sheriffs' 28 29 Association. 30 One (1) police chief shall be elected by the (e) 31 Police Chiefs' Association.

32 (f) The Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee,
33 Division B, and the Chairman of the House of Representatives
34 Judiciary "B" Committee, or their designees, shall serve as
35 legislative liaisons and nonvoting members.

36 (g) The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint two (2)
37 members, neither of whom is an attorney nor a member of the
38 Legislature.

39 (h) The Speaker of the House shall appoint two (2)
40 members, neither of whom is an attorney nor a member of the
41 Legislature.

42 (i) The Presidents of The Mississippi Bar and the
43 Magnolia Bar Association shall each appoint one (1) member, each
44 of whom shall be licensed to practice law in the State of
45 Mississippi.

46 (j) Two (2) prosecutors shall be elected by the
47 Prosecutors' Association, at least one (1) of whom is a District
48 Attorney or employed by a District Attorney.

49 (k) The Governor shall appoint one (1) Public Defender,50 who may work at either the trial or appellate level.

51 Members shall be appointed for a two-year term. Appointments 52 and vacancies on the study committee shall be filled by the 53 respective selecting and appointing authorities.

The purpose of the study committee shall be to make 54 (2) recommendations to the Legislature, the Department of Public 55 56 Safety, and the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning as to the needs of the Mississippi Crime Lab, including 57 58 obtaining statistical information with reference to cases in the various courts in Mississippi; conducting research relating to 59 improvement of the delivery of services to the judicial system and 60 the law enforcement agencies in the State of Mississippi; and 61 making a comprehensive study of the state Crime Lab for the 62 63 purpose of the improvement thereof. needs, including budget, staffing, and the best placement 65 66 administratively, of the current Crime Lab, as well as the 67 possibility of inaugurating satellite labs under the auspices of 68 the Criminal Justice Programs of the University of Southern 69 Mississippi in Hattiesburg and the University of Mississippi in 70 Oxford to assist the Crime Lab in the southern and northern thirds of the state by utilization of faculty and graduate student skills 71 72 to reduce the backlog of cases, and may make such policy recommendations as will promote the administration of justice. 73

74 (3) (a) The Governor shall set and give notice of the time, 75 date and place of the initial meeting, at which time the study committee shall elect a chairperson from its members who shall 76 77 preside at the meetings of the committee. The chair shall not vote unless necessary to break a tie vote of the committee. 78 Τn 79 addition, the committee shall elect a vice chair who shall preside 80 over meetings in the absence of the chair. The committee shall 81 elect any other officers which it considers necessary to carry out 82 the purpose of the committee. The committee may form any committees from its membership in order to assist the committee in 83 84 accomplishing its purposes as provided in this chapter.

(b) The committee shall meet quarterly and at such other times as meetings may be called by the chair. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting. Any final action taken by the study committee shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the nonlegislative members.

90 (4) The Department of Public Safety shall provide such
91 support of the Mississippi Satellite Crime Lab Study Committee as
92 is necessary to accomplish the purposes of this act, including,
93 but not limited to, research and clerical assistance.

94 (5) (a) In addition to the other duties specified, the 95 committee shall file a report with the Legislature not later than 96 November 15, 2006. The document shall report on the operational 97 and administrative state of the crime lab, with emphasis on the S. B. No. 2901 *SS02/R1059* 06/SS02/R1059

98 state of the case backlog. The report shall also make specific 99 recommendations for improvement in the administration and 100 operation of the crime lab.

101 The committee is authorized and empowered for the (b) 102 accomplishment of its purposes to undertake any studies, reviews, 103 inquiries, hearings, examinations, surveys or analyses as it may 104 deem pertinent, relevant and justified. The committee shall propose and prepare in detailed form for the consideration of the 105 106 Legislature such amendments to existing law, such statutes, and 107 such constitutional amendments as in the judgment of the committee 108 will improve the operation of the crime lab and promote the administration of justice. 109

110 The committee is authorized to call upon any and all (6) 111 existing courts, agencies, departments, divisions, officers, employees, boards, bureaus, commissions and institutions of the 112 State of Mississippi, or any political subdivision thereof, to 113 114 furnish such information, data and assistance as will enable it to 115 carry out its powers and duties hereunder and all such agencies, departments, divisions, officers, employees, boards, bureaus, 116 117 commissions and institutions of the State of Mississippi and its political subdivisions are hereby directed to cooperate with the 118 119 committee and render such information, data, aid and assistance as 120 may be requested by the committee.

121 (7) The committee shall have the power to enlist the 122 services of any agency, either public or private, or any individual or educational institution, bar association, research 123 124 organization, foundation or educational or civic organization for 125 assistance in accomplishing the purposes of this act, conducting 126 research studies, gathering information or printing and publishing The committee is authorized to make and sign any 127 its reports. 128 agreements or contracts to do or perform any actions that may be 129 necessary, desirable or proper to carry out the purposes and objectives of this chapter. 130

No. 2901 *SSO2/R1059* 06/SS02/R1059 PAGE 4 131 (8) The committee may employ any agents, clerks, 132 researchers, counsel, consultants and other personnel necessary 133 for the performance of the duties of the study committee and fix 134 their respective rates of compensation, all subject to the 135 approval of the State Personnel Board and within the amounts made 136 available by appropriation therefor or received from other 137 sources.

(9) Members of the committee shall receive a per diem as 138 provided in Section 25-3-69 for actual attendance upon meetings of 139 the study committee, together with reimbursement for traveling and 140 141 subsistence expenses incurred as provided in Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, except that members of the study 142 143 committee who are members of the Legislature shall not receive per 144 diem for attendance while the Legislature is in session and no member whose regular compensation is payable by the state or any 145 146 political subdivision of the state shall receive per diem for 147 attendance upon meetings of the study committee.

148 (10) The committee is authorized and empowered to receive 149 and expend any funds appropriated to it by the Legislature and any 150 funds received by it from any other source in carrying out the 151 objectives and purposes of this chapter.

152 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 153 and after July 1, 2006.
