SENATE BILL NO. 2951

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING ACT; TO ENACT
 DEFINITIONS; TO PROHIBIT TRAFFICKING OF PERSONS FOR FORCED LABOR
 OR SERVICES, INVOLUNTARY SERVITUDE, SEXUAL SERVITUDE OF A MINOR,
 AND UNLAWFUL CONDUCT WITH RESPECT TO DOCUMENTS IN FURTHERANCE OF
 TRAFFICKING OR INVOLUNTARY SERVITUDE, AND TO PROVIDE FOR LIABILITY
 OF AN ACCOMPLICE IN THOSE ACTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** For the purposes of this act, the following words
- 9 and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the
- 10 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 11 (a) "Actor" means a person who violates any of the 12 provisions of this act.
- 13 (b) "Extortion" means obtaining property or things of
- 14 value of another by threatening to (i) inflict bodily injury on
- 15 anyone; (ii) to commit any other criminal offense; or (iii) expose
- 16 any secret tending to subject any person to hatred, contempt or
- 17 ridicule.
- 18 (c) "Commercial sexual activity" means any sex act on
- 19 account of which anything of value is given to, promised to, or
- 20 received by any person.
- 21 (d) "Debt bondage" means the status or condition of a
- 22 debtor arising from a pledge by the debtor of his or her personal
- 23 services or of those of a person under his or her control as a
- 24 security for debt, if the value of those services as reasonably
- 25 assessed is not applied toward the liquidation of the debt or the
- 26 length and nature of those services are not reasonably limited and
- 27 defined.
- 28 (e) "Financial harm" includes, but is not limited to,
- 29 extortion as defined by Section 97-3-82, Mississippi Code of 1972,

- 30 violation of the usury law as defined by Title 75, Chapter 17,
- 31 Mississippi Code of 1972, or employment contracts that violate
- 32 Section 15-3-1, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 33 (f) "Forced labor or services" means labor or services,
- 34 that are performed or provided by another person and are obtained
- 35 or maintained through an actor:
- 36 (i) Causing or threatening to cause serious harm
- 37 to any person;
- 38 (ii) Physically restraining or threatening to
- 39 physically restrain any person;
- 40 (iii) Abusing or threatening to abuse the law or
- 41 legal process;
- 42 (iv) Knowingly destroying, concealing, removing,
- 43 confiscating or possessing any actual or purported passport or
- 44 other immigration document, or any other actual or purported
- 45 government identification document, of another person;
- 46 (v) Using extortion;
- 47 (vi) Causing or threatening to cause financial
- 48 harm to any person or using financial control over any person; or
- 49 (vii) Using any scheme, plan or pattern intended
- 50 to cause any person to believe that, if the person did not perform
- 51 such labor or services, that person or another person would suffer
- 52 serious harm or physical restraint.
- (g) "Labor" means work of economic or financial value.
- (h) "Maintain" means, in relation to labor or services,
- 55 to secure continued performance thereof, regardless of any initial
- 56 agreement on the part of the trafficked person to perform such
- 57 labor or service.
- (i) "Minor" means a person under the age of eighteen
- 59 (18) years.
- (j) "Obtain" means, in relation to labor or services,
- 61 to secure performance thereof.

- (k) "Services" means an ongoing relationship between a
- 63 person and the actor in which the person performs activities under
- 64 the supervision of or for the benefit of the actor or a third
- 65 party. Commercial sexual activity and sexually explicit
- 66 performances shall be considered services under this act.
- 67 (1) "Sexually-explicit performance" means a live or
- 68 public act or show intended to arouse or satisfy the sexual
- 69 desires or appeal to the prurient interests of patrons.
- 70 (m) "Trafficked person" means a person subjected to the
- 71 practices prohibited by this act and is a term used
- 72 interchangeably with the terms "victim of trafficking" and
- 73 "trafficking victim."
- 74 (n) "Venture" means any group of two (2) or more
- 75 individuals associated in fact, whether or not a legal entity.
- 76 (o) "Sexually oriented material" is defined by Section
- 77 97-5-27, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 78 (p) "Human Trafficking" includes, but is not limited
- 79 to, one or more of the following:
- 80 (i) To trade or barter individuals for forced
- 81 labor or services;
- 82 (ii) Involuntary servitude;
- 83 (iii) Sexual servitude, or unlawful conduct with
- 84 respect to documents in furtherance of forced labor or services,
- 85 involuntary servitude, or sexual conduct.
- 86 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Trafficking of Persons for Forced Labor or
- 87 **Services.** (1) Whoever knowingly:
- 88 (a) Recruits, entices, harbors, transports, provides or
- 89 obtains by any means, or attempts to recruit, entice, harbor,
- 90 transport, provide or obtain by any means, another person,
- 91 intending or knowing that the person will be subjected to forced
- 92 labor or services; or
- 93 (b) Benefits, whether financially or by receiving
- 94 anything of value, from participation in a venture that has

- 95 engaged in an act described in violation of subsection (2) or (3)
- 96 of this section, shall be committed to the custody of the
- 97 Department of Corrections for not more than twenty (20) years.
- 98 (2) **Involuntary Servitude.** Whoever knowingly subjects, or
- 99 attempts to subject, another person to forced labor or services
- 100 shall be punished by commitment to the custody of the Department
- 101 of Corrections for not more than twenty (20) years.
- 102 (3) **Sexual Servitude of a Minor.** Whoever knowingly
- 103 subjects, or attempts to subject, or who recruits, entices,
- 104 harbors, transports, provides or obtains by any means, or attempts
- 105 to recruit, entice, harbor, transport, provide or obtain by any
- 106 means, a minor knowing that the minor will engage in commercial
- 107 sexual activity, sexually-explicit performance, or the production
- 108 of sexually oriented material or causes or attempts to cause a
- 109 minor to engage in commercial sexual activity, sexually-explicit
- 110 performance, or the production of sexually oriented material shall
- 111 be punished by commitment to the custody of the Department of
- 112 Corrections as follows:
- 113 (a) In cases involving a minor between the ages of
- 114 sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years, not involving force or
- 115 threat of force, for not more than twenty (20) years;
- (b) In cases in which the minor had not attained the
- 117 age of sixteen (16) years, not involving force or threat of force,
- 118 for not more than twenty-five (25) years; and
- 119 (c) In cases in which the violation was sexual
- 120 servitude of a minor, for not more than thirty (30) years.
- 121 (4) Unlawful Conduct with Respect to Documents in
- 122 Furtherance of Trafficking or Involuntary Servitude. Anyone who
- 123 knowingly destroys, conceals, removes, confiscates or possesses,
- 124 or attempts to destroy, conceal, remove, confiscate or possess,
- 125 any actual or purported passport or other immigration document, or
- 126 any other actual or purported government identification document,
- 127 of any person to prevent or restrict or attempt to prevent or

- 128 restrict, without lawful authority, the person's liberty to move
- 129 or travel in order to maintain the labor or services of that
- 130 person, when the person is or has been a victim of a violation set
- 131 out in subsection (1), (2) or (3) shall be punished by commitment
- 132 to the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than
- 133 five (5) years.
- 134 (5) Accomplice liability. Whoever knowingly aids abets or
- 135 conspires with one or more persons to violate subsection (1), (2),
- 136 (3) or (4) of this section shall be punishable in the same manner
- 137 as for a completed violation of that subsection.
- 138 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 139 and after July 1, 2006.
