SENATE BILL NO. 2961

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-7-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2	PROVIDE THAT BIDS RELATING TO COMMODITIES GROWN, PROCESSED OR
3	MANUFACTURED WITHIN THIS STATE SHALL BE GIVEN PREFERENCE IF THE
4	PRICE IN SUCH BIDS ARE NOT MORE THAN 10% GREATER THAT THE LOWEST
5	AND BEST BIDDER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 31-7-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 31-7-15. (1) (a) Whenever two (2) or more competitive bids
- 10 are received, and one or more * * * relates to commodities grown,
- 11 processed or manufactured within this state, the bids relating to
- 12 commodities grown, processed or manufactured within this state
- 13 shall be given preference if:
- 14 (i) The prices in received bids that relate to the
- commodities grown, processed or manufactured in this state are not
- 16 more than ten percent (10%) greater than the lowest and best
- 17 bidder; and
- 18 (ii) All other things stated in such received bids
- 19 are equal with respect to * * * quality and service * * *.
- 20 (b) A * * * preference similar to that authorized in
- 21 paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be given to commodities
- 22 grown, processed or manufactured within this state whenever
- 23 purchases are made without competitive bids, and when practical
- 24 the Department of Finance and Administration may by regulation
- 25 establish reasonable preferential policies for other commodities,
- 26 giving preference to resident suppliers of this state.
- 27 (2) Any foreign manufacturing company with a factory in the
- 28 state and with over fifty (50) employees working in the state

- 29 shall have preference over any other foreign company where both
- 30 price and quality are the same, regardless of where the product is
- 31 manufactured.
- 32 (3) On or before January 1, 1991, the Department of Finance
- 33 and Administration shall adopt bid and product specifications to
- 34 be utilized by all state agencies that encourage the procurement
- 35 of commodities made from recovered materials. Preference in
- 36 awarding contracts for commodities shall be given to commodities
- 37 offered at a competitive price.
- 38 (4) Each state agency is required to procure products made
- 39 from recovered materials when those products are available at a
- 40 competitive price. For purposes of this subsection, "competitive
- 41 price" means a price not greater than ten percent (10%) above the
- 42 lowest and best bidder. A decision not to procure products made
- 43 from recovered materials must be based on a determination that
- 44 such procurement:
- 45 (a) Is not available within a reasonable period of
- 46 time; or
- 47 (b) Fails to meet the performance standards set forth
- 48 in the applicable specifications; or
- 49 (c) Is not available at a competitive price.
- 50 (5) Whenever economically feasible, each state agency is
- 51 required to purchase products manufactured or sold by the
- 52 Mississippi Industries for the Blind.
- 53 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 54 and after July 1, 2006.
